P.G. DIPLOMA IN COMPUTER SCIENCE & APPLICATIONS *

Title.
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ORDINANCE NO.32

1. Duration of Course:

The duration of the course of study for the P.G. Diploma in Computer Science and Application Programme shall extend over two semester in one academic year and it will be a full time programme. The course will commence in July every year. The number of seats is limited to 30.

2. Eligibility for the Course :

Every candidate seeking admission to the P.G. Diploma in Computer Science and Application Programme shall have bachelor's degree with atleast second division marks in aggregate in any discipline including Arts/Commerce/Science/Law/Medicine/Engineering/Veterinary Science/Agriculture/Technology etc. of the Vikram University, Ujjain or of any other statutory university recognised as equivalent thereto. The candidate must have also passed mathematics at 10 + 2 stage of Madhya Pradesh Board of Secondary Education or its equivalent.

Candidates, who have not obtained a Bachelor's degree at the time to application but plan to appear in the final year of a degree examination during the academic session, may also apply. However, such candidates will be given provisional admission and they must produce evidence of having passed the Bachelor's degree with atleast II division marks in aggregate by 16th August failing which their admission shall be cancelled and fee and other charges paid by them shall not be refunded.

3. Student admitted to the course shall not be allowed to join any other course of study or appear in any other examination.
4. Subject to the requirements of admission indicated above, admission to the programme shall be on merit determined on the basis of entrance examination procedure as per rules/directions of the University.
5. The admission fee, tuition fee, examination fee and other fees shall be the same as has been prescribed for other post graduate degree under the faculty of Science/Life Science.
6. The P.G. Diploma in Computer Science and Application Programme shall consist of two semesters and there shall be a University examination at the end of each semester. The semesters shall be run consecutively.
7. A candidate who has been admitted to the P.G. Diploma in Computer Science and Application Programme in terms of the provisions referred to in paragraph(2) above and who has attended a regular

course of study for the full semester period, shall be appear in the examination of that semester. However, no candidate shall be eligible to take any semester examination unless he has attended atleast 75% of the lectures delivered.

8. Students appearing in the second semester examination, should submit their Project Report in triplicate atleast two weeks before the commencement of that semester examination, failing which they will not be allowed to appear in the examination of other papers of that semester.
9. A candidate shall be eligible to appear in the second semester examination only after having passed the first semester examination.
 Provided that if a candidate fails in any one paper in first semester examination, he will be promoted to the second semester course. A candidate failing in one paper of any semester shall be eligible to take examination of the paper in which he has failed along with the examination of the same semester concerned.
10. If a candidate fails in internal assessment of even one paper, he shall not be permitted to take the University examination of that semester.
11. If a candidate fails in more than one paper in any semester examination but has passed in internal assessment, he may be allowed to appear as an ex-student in the examination of the semester in which he has failed. However, if a candidate fails in internal assessment, he shall be required to secure admission in the semester in which he has failed.
12. The courses of study for each semester shall be as per the scheme, provided in the prospectus. These will be subject to changes from time to time. Unless otherwise provided examination in each paper shall be of three hours duration.
13. Candidates shall have to pass separately in the University examination and internal assessment.
14. For passing each semester examination, the candidates shall be required to secure atleast 25% marks in each theory paper of the University examination, 40% in practicals, 40% marks in internal assessment separately, 40% marks in aggregate in all the theory papers shall be compulsory.
15. Candidates shall be awarded division after their having duly passed all the two semester examination and internal assessment on the basis of the aggregate marks obtained in all the two semester examination and all the internal assessment.

The division shall be awarded as follows:-

First division : 65% or above of the aggregate marks

Second division : 48% or above but less than 65% of the aggregate marks.

Pass : Less than 48% but above 40% in Aggregate.

ORDINANCE NO.33

ADMISSION OF FOREIGN STUDENTS TO A COLLEGE/UNIVERSITY TEACHING DEPARTMENT OR SCHOOL OF STUDIES.

Refer clause i and viii of Section 37.

1. In this ordinance, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context -
 - (a) Foreign Student's means a student who is not an Indian National.
 - (b) The other terms and expressions used in this ordinance shall have the same meaning as assigned to them under the M.P. Vishwavidyalaya Adhiniyam 1973 (as amended from time to time) and the relevant statutes and ordinances made there under.
2. All cases of foreign students for admission to various courses in the S.O.S./ U.T.D. / Colleges affiliated to the University shall be regulated in accordance with the directives issued by the Govt. of India from time to time.
3. Foreign students who desire to come to India for higher studies shall apply directly to the University. If the candidate fulfills all the qualifications, the University shall issue provisional admission letter to him and inform the concerned Indian Mission. On the basis of the provisional admission letter, the Mission will issue a student visa to enable the student to come to India and Join the University. No Colleges or U.T.D. / S.O.S. is authorized to issue provisional admission letter (They are for-bidden from doing so). It will be the sole responsibility of the student to seek admission in the SDS/UTD or affiliated college within the time limit prescribed for admissions.
4. Not withstanding anything contained in any other ordinance, the following fees will be payable by the foreign students :-

(1) Eligibility Certificate Fees	Rs. 400.00	<i>Revised</i>
(2) Immigration Fee	Rs. 100.00	
(3) Registration fee at the time of first admission	Rs. 2000.00	
(4) Fee for renewal of Registration for every subsequent year.	Rs. 500.00	
5. Renewal fee will not be charged for gap-years i.e. when the student has not availed of facilities for studies in the particular year.
6. Not withstanding anything contained in part IV of ordinance number 6 (Examinations) (General), no foreign student shall be permitted to appear in any examination of the University as a non-collegiate student. He can not be a domicile within the jurisdiction of the University.

7. No foreign student shall be admitted to any S.O.S. / U.T.D. / College affiliated to the University unless he fulfills the following conditions :-
- (i) He/She possesses eligibility certificate issued by the University;
 - (ii) He/She has deposited the requisite Registration / Renewal Fee;
 - (iii) He/She has deposited the requisite immigration fee;
 - (iv) He/She produces in original the pass port and valid Student/Visa;
 - (v) He/She submits certificate of the competent Medical Officer to the effect that he/she is not suffering from A.I.D.S.;
 - (vi) He/She produces a certificate from the district administration / police department that his/her name has been enrolled in the registrar of Foreign Nationals; and
 - (vii) He/She produces original certificates of qualifying examinations.
8. The eligibility certificate, and other documents will be issued to the candidate in person, on production of valid evidence for identity, like passport, visa, etc. .The student should necessarily present himself. These certificates will not be granted & issued to his agents/representatives/friends etc., student himself is essential and binding.
9. If any dispute arrises regarding the interpretation of any provision(s) of this ordinance of for matters and situations not covered by this ordinance, the matter shall be referred to the Kulpati of the University whose decision thereon shall be final and binding.

ORDINANCE NO.34

Ordinance relating to Admission and Examinations for 1½ years (3 semesters) Post-Graduate Course leading to Master of Engineering in Civil Engineering Specialising in Environmental Engineering and Pollution Control.

1. (a) A regular candidate, seeking admission to Master of Engineering Programme, shall have passed Bachelor of Engineering Examination in Civil Engineering from a recognised University / Institute or its equivalent with a minimum of 60% aggregate marks and shall have qualified in the GATE.
- (b) A sponsored candidate, seeking admission to Master of Engineering Programme, shall have passed Bachelor of Civil Engineering from a recognised University / Institute or its equivalent with minimum 55% aggregate marks and shall have acquired minimum two years experience in the field/teaching of Civil Engineering, after passing the B.E. sponsored candidates with A.M.I.E. and minimum two years experience in the field/teaching of Civil Engineering after acquiring A.M.I.E., can be considered for admission to the course subject to availability of seats and passing admission test.
2. (a) The curriculum for the degree for regular candidates shall extend over three academic semesters.
- (b) Regular teachers of the affiliated college admitted to the Post-Graduate Course may take maximum of three theory papers per semester, however the total period taken by them to complete the course shall not be less than a total of 5 semesters.
- (c) M.E. course should be completed within 3 years by regular candidates and within 4 years by regular teachers of the affiliated college undergoing course, from registration / admission.
3. (a) The curriculum for the degree course shall consist of subjects as set forth in the scheme of examinations and teaching, each of which shall be studied by attendance in lectures, tutorials, laboratory, field work, drawing work as prescribed in its syllabus.
- (b) Every candidate shall be required to submit for examination a thesis in triplicate on a research problem that will be assigned to him (prior to third semester programme) and on which he has worked during third semester under the supervision of a guide from amongst the teaching staff.
4. (a) Examinations shall be conducted at the end of each semester, as per the scheme of examinations, and shall be named as under :-

(i) At the end of First Semester :-

Master of Engineering (Civil Engineering- Environmental Engineering and Pollution Control)- 1 Semester Examination.

(ii) At the end of Second semester :-

Master of Engineering (Civil Engineering - Environmental Engineering and Pollution Control)- 2 Semester Examination.

(iii) At the end of Third Semester :-

Master of Engineering (Civil Engineering - Environmental Engineering and Pollution Control) - 3 Semester Examination.

(b) Along with semester examination for regular candidates examinations for other semesters shall be conducted, if compartmental candidates are registered for such other semester examinations.

5. (a) A candidate, who after obtaining admission to the post-graduate course, has successfully prosecuted regular courses of studies at Engineering College affiliated to Vikram University, for one academic semester, shall be eligible for appearing at Master of Engineering (1 semester) Examination.

(b) A candidate who, after passing Master of Engineering (1 semester) Examination of the University, has successfully prosecuted regular courses of studies, for one academic semester, shall be eligible for appearing at Master of Engineering (2 Semester) Examination.

(c) A candidate who, after passing Master of Engineering (2 semester) Examination of the University, has successfully prosecuted regular courses of studies, for one academic semester, shall be eligible for appearing at Master of Engineering (3 and final semester) Examination.

Explanation : " Successful Prosecution of Course " means that the candidate has attended 85% of lectures, tutorials / practicals sessionals held during the semester as per norms of the University according to the "Scheme of Examinations and Teaching" and satisfactorily completed the allotted works.

(d) A candidate who has failed to secure the minimum pass marks in sessionals shall not be eligible for appearing at Master of Engineering Examinations.

6. In order to pass a candidate must obtain atleast :-

- (a) 40 percent of full marks in each written paper,
- (b) 60 percent of full marks in each sessional work,
- (c) 50 percent of full marks in each practical/ project /thesis / viva-voce examination.
- (d) 50 percent of total aggregate marks.

7. (a) Those of the candidates who secure 55% or more of the marks in aggregate for all semester examinations taken together and have passed in the examinations will be declared to have passed the examination in second class.
- (b) Those of the candidates who secure 65% or more marks in aggregate for all semester examinations taken together and have passed the examinations will be declared to have passed in First Class.
- (c) Those of the candidate who secure 75% or more marks in aggregate for all semester examinations taken together and have passed the examinations will be declared to have passed in First Class with Distinction.
- (d) No division will be awarded for semester examinations.
- (e) No candidate will be allowed to submit his thesis unless he has passed Master of Engineering (1 Semester) Examination and Master of Engineering (2 Semester) Examination.
- (f) Divisions will be declared only after the thesis has been examined and on the aggregate marks obtained in all the three semester examinations, taken together.
8. (a) A candidate shall be admitted (awarded) to the Degree of Master of Engineering in Civil Engineering Specialising in Environmental Engineering and Pollution Control after passing Master of Engineering (3 and final semester) Examination.
9. (a) An unsuccessful examinee who has failed in not more than one theory paper or one practical shall be placed in compartment in such theory paper or practical, such candidate shall be declared successful at subsequent examination if he obtains at the examination the prescribed minimum pass marks in theory / practical in which he has been place in the compartment and also secures the prescribed minimum aggregate marks for passing.
- (b) If a candidate fails to obtain the prescribed minimum of 50 percent marks in total aggregate but passes in all theory papers, practicals, sessionals, at any semester examination, he shall also be placed in the compartment at this semester examination in one theory paper in which he has secured minimum marks. Such candidate will be declared successful if he secures adequate marks in the subject of his choice at the subsequent examination so as to make up the total aggregate to a minimum of 50 percent.
- (c) A compartmental candidate who falls in category 9(a) and 9(b) above shall be allowed maximum of two more attempts at the subsequent examinations to pass in compartmental subjects.
- (d) Not withstanding any thing contained in this ordinance a compartmental candidate who falls in category 9(a) and 9(b) above shall be allowed to persue his studies in the next higher semester and to appear at this semester examination.

- (e) A candidate who fails to clear compartmental subject of Master of Engineering (1 semester) Examination shall not be eligible to take admission in Master of Engineering (3 semester) Course.
- (f) A candidate who fails twice in any semester examination will not be readmitted to the college as a regular student.

ORDINANCE NO.35

Admission of students to Law Courses

- (1) This ordinance shall be deemed to be enforced from the session 1988-89.
- (2) Candidates who holds a Bachelor's or Master degree with atleast 45% marks in the aggregate of the university or an examination recognised equivalent there to by the university and has prosecuted a regular course of study for one academic year in the university department of the law or in any Law college affiliated to the university shall be eligible for admission of LL.B. part I examination.
- (3) The students who have passed their qualifying examination from a recognised University out of Madhya Pradesh shall be required to pay the following fees :-
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| (1) At the time of admission | (a) University registration fees. | Rs.1500/- |
| | (b) College registration fees | Rs.1000/- |
| (2) For further each year's/ | (a) University registration fees | Rs. 300/- |
| | (b) College registration fees | Rs. 200/- |
- The admission shall be given after depositing the above fees.
- (4) The employees of State/Central Government or State/Central Government undertakings and sons / daughters of State / Central Government employees or State / Central Government undertakings posted under the jurisdiction of this University shall not be required to pay the above fees even if they have passed their qualifying examination from the University out of Madhya Pradesh.
- (5) The students who have passed their qualifying examination from the Universities of M.P. or other State and already registered for the Law Courses shall be exempted from payment of the above prescribed fees.
- (6) The other conditions of admission shall remain the same as prescribed in ordinance concerned.

ORDINANCE NO.36

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY
(Under the Faculty of Ayurved)

1. A candidate for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy must at the time of application, hold Master's Degree of the University, deemed University or any of the other University incorporated by any law for the time being in force and recognised by the University.

Provided that no one shall be eligible to supplicate for the Ph.D. Degree in the University unless he/she has secured at least 55% marks or an equivalent grade at the Master's Degree Examination or holds an M.Phil. Degree in the subject of his research.

Provided that for Ph.D. Degree in Ayurveda, a candidate who possesses a degree of Ayurveda from a recognised University will also be eligible for registration, if he is a teacher in an Ayurvedic college affiliated to Vikram University, Ujjain and has at least 10 years teaching experience to degree classes in an Ayurvedic College.

Note :- This provision will stand withdrawn for a particular subject of Ayurveda when an Ayurvedic College affiliated to Vikram University, Ujjain starts post-graduate course in that subject.

2. A candidate for the Ph.D. Degree must apply for registration of his subject on the prescribed form stating :
- (i) His qualification and experience
 - (ii) Subject in which he proposes to work
 - (iii) The field or topic of research
 - (iv) The name of supervisor (alongwith name of co-supervisor if any) under whom and the place/places at which he wishes to carry on his investigations together with the supervisor's consent.

Note :- A candidate can have two supervisors. Persons intending to conduct part or all research work, outside the Vikram University jurisdiction should have a supervisor from U.T.D./College and co-supervisor from the place, where the work is proposed to be conducted.

The application shall be accompanied by :

- (a) A fee of Rs. 100/- for registration.
- (b) A certificate from the Head of the University Teaching Department or the Principal of the College affiliated to the University or the Head of the Research Institute recognised for the purpose by the University testifying that adequate facilities exist and stating that the Head of the University Teaching Department or the principal or the Head of the Research Institute will in case the candidate is permitted,

allow the candidate to work in his department or college or institution under the supervision of the person mentioned in the application.

- (c) Attested copies of the marks sheet/grade sheet of Master's degree examination. Application for registration may be submitted any time during the academic year.

3. ~~After six months of his application, the candidate shall submit~~ a synopsis of his proposed research work alongwith the title of thesis (in seven copies) duly forwarded by the supervisor. He shall also make an oral presentation of the proposed work before a committee consisting of the following members :-

- (1) Vice-Chancellor or his nominee
- (2) Dean of the Faculty
- (3) Head of the U.T.D. in the subject/chairman, Board of Studies in the subject (where there is no U.T.D. in the subject)
- (4) One University professor in the subject appointed by Kulpati ordinarily from a list recommended by the supervisor.
- (5) Supervisor of the candidate.

The meeting of the committee will be held in the University Office. The committee (without the supervisor) shall recommend the eligibility of the person for appointment as supervisor.

The committee shall recommend suitability of the topic of research and the registration of the candidate for the Ph.D. degree. On approval by the committee, the candidate would be deemed to be registered from the date the Head of the Department forwarded the application or the date on which the candidate deposits the registration fee, whichever is later.

4. In case of registration for the Ph.D. Degree, the candidate will have to enrol himself as a student and will have to pay the following fees to the University Teaching Department of the College affiliated to the University where he is pursuing the research from the date of his registration till the date of submission of his thesis.

Provided that teachers of the University/College under the U.G.C. scheme of the teacher fellowship will not be required to pay fees.

5. A candidate shall ordinarily be permitted to work for Ph.D. Degree in the subject in which he has obtained his Master's Degree.

Provided that research work leading to Ph.D. Degree may be allowed in allied subjects in the same faculty or an allied faculty. In such cases the candidate may also be permitted to work under two supervisors.

6. The candidate shall have to pass in a written examination in a paper on research methodology the syllabus of which will be prepared by a committee of the Deans appointed by Kulpati. The syllabus of the paper will be available to the candidate from the University. The examination may be taken by the candidate any time after registration. The examination will be held each year in the month of May.

Provided that the candidates already having M.Phil. degree will not be required to pass the examination.

7. A candidate shall pursue his research at one of the Teaching Departments of the University or one of the post-graduate colleges affiliated to the University in the subject concerned and recognised for the purpose by the University.

Provided that the candidate may complete part or all research work in a research institute or any established research department or laboratory or a department of any University under the supervision of the Scientist/ Director / Professor of the institute who may or may not be the co-supervisor of the candidate.

8. (a) The person recommended for appointment as supervisor to guide research scholar must be :-
- (i) A Professor / Reader in a Teaching Department of the University or a College affiliated to the University and who either possesses a degree of the Doctorate standard or has published at least five research papers in standard national / international research journals.

OR

- (ii) (a) A teacher of the Teaching Department of the University or a College affiliated to the University who has obtained a Doctorate degree in the subject and has published at least five research papers in standard national / international research journals.

- (b) The person recommended for appointment as co-supervisor to guide research scholar together with the supervisor must be :-

A teacher or research worker of any University or organisation who has obtained a Doctorate Degree in the subject and has published at least five research papers in standard national / international research journals.

Provided that the teachers, who have been guiding research work under repealed ordinance shall continue to be recognised as supervisors in respect of the already registered research scholars.

Provided that a person who is himself registered for Ph.D. degree of any University shall not be eligible to be appointed as supervisor or a member of any committee mentioned in this ordinance.

Provided further that any recognised supervisor who fails to publish any research paper in standard national / international research journals independently over a duration of 5 years, will not be eligible to be supervisor of any new candidate.

9. The candidate shall pursue his research at the approved place of research under the supervisor, and on the approved subject for not less than twenty four months commencing from the date of his registration. The candidate may submit his thesis not before 24 months or not later than five calendar years from the date of registration. In case a candidate does not submit his thesis within five calendar years from the date of registration, his registration for Ph.D. degree shall get automatically cancelled.

Provided also that a candidate must hold the appropriate post-graduate degree with at least three years standing at the time of submission of his thesis.

Provided that a candidate may be allowed on his or supervisors request to change the supervisor, on the recommendation of a committee consisting of the Dean of the faculty, Head of the U.T.D. in the subject (or chairman of Board of studies in the subject when there is no U.T.D. in the subject) and supervisor under special circumstances to be recorded by the committee. No change in the topic of research shall, however, be permitted due to change in supervisor.

The University shall obtain every six months a record of attendance and a progress report of the work of the Research Scholar from his supervisor concerned and if the progress of work is found unsatisfactory in two successive reports or no report is received for a period of one year the Kulpati may order the removal of the name of the scholar from the list of those registered for the Ph.D. Degree.

10. After the completion of the research work and two months before the intended date of submission of the thesis the candidate will be required to make an open presentation of his work before a committee consisting of the following members :-

- (1) Rector or a nominee of Kulpati
- (2) Dean of the faculty
- (3) Head of the U.T.D. in the subject / chairman, Board of studies in the subject (when there is no U.T.D. in the subject)

- (4) One University professor in the subject, appointed by Kulpati ordinarily from a list recommended by the supervisor.
- (5) Supervisor of the candidate.

This presentation will be made at the U.T.D. in the subject or at any U.T.D. for subjects where there is no U.T.D. fixed for the purpose by the University Office.

The committee shall have power to (i) approve the work for submission (ii) to recommend modifications (iii) to disallow submission of the thesis for reasons recorded by the committee. The presentation shall be open to all interested and shall be announced on the Notice Board, at least a week before.

11. After two months of the meeting of the committee referred to in para (10) and after published at least two research papers in some standard national / international research journals, the candidate shall supply four printed / typewritten / photocopies (but not published) and hard bound copies of his thesis and separately four copies of the summary of the thesis. Published papers may be incorporated as part of the thesis, as text or appendices.

Note:-(1) The list of standard national / international research journals will be prepared by the standing committee of the academic council from among the list prepared by the professors of U.T.D. in the subject (or college professors for those subjects in which there is no U.T.D.).

(2) This list shall, ordinarily not include any in-house journal.

(3) This list shall not include any magazine, news paper etc.

12. The thesis shall comply with the following conditions :-

- (i) It must be a piece of research work characterised either by the discover of facts or by a fresh approach towards the interpretation of facts. In either case it should evince the candidate's capacity for critical examination and sound judgement. The candidate shall communicate how far the thesis embodies the result of his own observations and in what respect his investigations appear to advance knowledge in the subject.
- (ii) It shall be satisfactory in point of language and presentation of subject matter.
- (iii) The thesis shall be accompanied by a declaration from the candidate that the thesis embodies his own work and a certificate from the supervisor stating (a) that the thesis embodies the work of the candidate himself (b) that the candidate worked under him for the period required under para 9, and (c) that in the opinion of the supervisor the thesis fulfils the requirements of the ordinance relating to the Ph.D. Degree of the University. In case there is a co-supervisor, a joint certificate will be required.

The candidate shall have to submit an affidavit stating that :-

- (a) the thesis embodies the work of the candidate himself, and
- (b) the candidate has worked under the guidance of the supervisor at the approved place of work and for the period required under para (9) of this ordinance.

The candidate shall also remit with the thesis a sum of Rs. 300/- (Three Hundred Only).

The candidate will also be required to bear the cost of postage of the thesis sent to examiners, if he wishes it to be sent by Air Mail.

13. On receipt of the thesis, along with the certificates, affidavit and the fee mentioned above, the supervisor shall be asked to submit a panel of 10 names for appointment of examiners, who should not be below the rank of Professor / Reader. The suggested examiners should not be from the territorial jurisdiction of the University. He shall certify that the suggested examiners have been actively doing research in the concerned field of research. Wherever possible three foreign examiners should be suggested. Kulpati shall, ordinarily appoint three examiners from the panel to whom the thesis shall be sent for evaluation. Kulpati may request the supervisor to cite some publications by the suggested examiners in the area of the thesis. Kulpati may appoint examiners other than those mentioned in the panel, if he so desires.
14. (a) In case all examiners disapprove the thesis or two of them disapprove the thesis and the other recommends a revision or acceptance, it shall be rejected.
- (b) If one of the examiners approves the thesis, and the other recommends a revision and the third rejects it, the candidate shall be called upon to submit the thesis after revision in the light of the examiner's observations.
- (c) In case all the three original examiners approve the thesis or two approve and the third examiner either disapproves or recommends revision, the candidate shall be called upon to appear for a viva-voce exam. Viva-voce exam. will be open to all persons interested and shall be conducted by the Board of Examiners consisting of supervisor and one of the original examiners of the thesis, selected by Kulpati. If both the viva-voce examiners are satisfied the case shall be reported to the executive council for the award of the degree.

Provided that the kulpati may, looking to the special circumstances of the case, appoint an alternative viva-voce examiner, if any or both of the examiners are not in a position to conduct the viva-voce examination.

The viva-voce test shall be conducted at the U.T.D. in the subject or at any U.T.D. for subjects where there is no U.T.D. (fixed for the purpose by the University Office). The viva-voce test shall be preceded by about an one - hour

seminar to be conducted by the candidate. The announcement of viva-voce test will be made on the notice board at least a week before.

After the seminar, the viva-voce test as mentioned above will be conducted by the board of examiners in the presence of teachers of the University if present. Other interested persons including research scholars in the subject concerned may also attend. At this test, only the examiners appointed for the viva-voce test would ask the questions of the candidate. Others will submit their questions in writing to the chairman who may put such of those questions to the candidate as he deem fit.

The examiners at the oral examination may ask questions beyond the subject of the thesis in order to satisfy themselves that the candidate has adequate knowledge of the particular branch of the subject on which he has submitted the thesis.

(d) In case the recommendations of the viva-voce examiners differ from that of the thesis examiners or there is a difference of opinion between the viva-voce examiners the candidate may be asked to reappear at a second viva-voce examination within six months. If the candidate fails to satisfy the viva-voce examiners a second time, his thesis shall be finally rejected. Such a candidate who would be required to appear at the second viva-voce test shall pay an additional fee of Rs.100/-

15. If the examiners recommend that the candidate be asked to revise / improve his thesis, the executive council shall permit the candidate to resubmit his thesis not earlier than six months and not later than eighteen months, the period being counted from the date of the resolution of the executive council granting the permission.

In case a candidate is allowed to resubmit his thesis he will have to pay a fresh fee of Rs.300/- at the time of resubmitting his thesis but it shall not be necessary for him to reproduce any certificate of further attendance at the institution at which he carried on his work.

The resubmitted thesis shall be examined as far as possible by the old set of examiners.

16. (i) The examiners may seek clarification of the subject matter of the thesis from the supervisor. The provision will be incorporated in the latter to be sent to the examiners while sending the thesis.

(ii) The Kulpati shall be competent to recall thesis from an examiner who fails to send the report within six months of the date of despatch of the thesis and appoint another examiner.

17. The examiners shall categorically recommend in the prescribed proforma acceptance or rejection or revision of the thesis and also give their detailed comments. The examiners shall state if the thesis complies with the following conditions in case they
