( Under Section 37(ii) to IV )

1. Name : Ordinance for 'Post Master's Diploma Course In Adult/Continuing Education'

2. Duration : The duration of this course of study shall be one year and will be full time course.

Private candidates are not allowed to appear in the examination of this course.

3. Admission : Every candidate seeking admission to the Diploma Course shall have passed Master's Degree in Social Sciences / Social Work/Humanities/Education Sciences/Home Science. Degree of this University or any other University recognised as equivalent thereto with atleast in Second Division or with Grade 'B' in the seven point scale.

An application for admission shall be made on the prescribed form and admission shall be made subject to approval of the Director/Head, ACEE.

4. Examination : The Diploma Examination shall consist of the following :-

1.	Five Theory Papers	
	100 marks each	500 marks
2.	Dissertation	200 marks
3.	Viva Voce	100 marks
4.	Seminar	100 marks
5.	Field Work	100 marks

Total 1000 Marks

(Such Courses as may be prescribed by the University from time to time)

5. For passing the examination the candidate shall be required to secure 36% in each of the prescribed course and 40% in total aggregate and shall have to pass in theory papers and Dissertation / Seminar / Field Work

First Division - 60% or more marks  
Second Division - 40% or more marks

6. There shall be no supplementary or second examination. A failure does not retain his seat next year. He will have to apply afresh.

However, if a candidate passing in the Seminar and has submitted the project report and fails to appear in the annual examination due to sickness, he can appear in the annual examination next year.

If a candidate has failed in theory papers but has passed in Field Work/Dissertation, he/she shall have to appear in theory papers only in Annual Examination next year. His/her marks for Field Work/Dissertation will be carried forward next year.

7. Medium of Instructions and Examination will in Hindi/English.
8. No candidate shall be allowed to take the examination unless he has :
- i) attended atleast 75% of lectures delivered
  - ii) paid all dues
  - iii) Obtained 'no dues' from Library Hostel and Department.
  - iv) Submitted the Project Report atleast one month before beginning of the examination.

9. Dissertation

The subject and supervisor of the Dissertation will be allotted to the candidate by the Director at the beginning of the session. A candidate will be required to submit three typed copies of the Dissertation.

The work will be valued by internal and external examiners out of 100 marks each.

The Supervisor shall be internal examiner. The Viva Voce on dissertation shall be conducted by the internal and external examiner.

10. Seminar :

The candidate will be required to present one paper each in two seminars. The evaluation will be done jointly by the Supervisor and atleast two teachers nominated by the Director.

11. Field Work :

Every candidate will be required to submit the Project Report of the field work being done under the guidance of the teacher-in-charge who shall also evaluate it and submit his report and marks.

12. Qualification of Examiners :

Qualification for all the Examinations  
(Theory, Dissertation/Viva)

All the Directors and Assistant Directors of Adult / Continuing Education of recognised University / institution.

Professors - Who have worked in the field of Adult/Continuing Education.

Project Officers :- Three year teaching experience in the subject concerned.

13. Remuneration :

~~The remuneration for setting question paper/marking answer books / Project Report / Dissertation / Viva-Voce will be as per University Ordinance for Postgraduate Examination.~~

14. Qualification of Teacher :

All the Directors/Assistant Directors/Project Officers of Adult/Continuing Education of recognised University Institutions who has atleast 5 years Field Experience/Teaching Experience in Adult Education.

Any teacher of a University of college with teaching experience of 5 years in Adult Education/Statistics / Economics with specialisation in Adult Education/Sociology.

15. Fee :

1. Name : Ordinance for Master's Degree in  
1) POPULATION EDUCATION  
2) RURAL STUDIES  
3) JOURNALISM & MASS COMMUNICATION

2. Duration : The duration of this course of study shall be 2 years and will be a full time course.

Private candidates are not allowed to appear in the examination of this course.

3. Admission : Every candidate seeking admission to the Master's Degree Course shall be passed Bachelor's Degree of any faculty of this University or any other University recognised as equivalent thereto in accordance with University guidelines.

An application for admission shall be made on the prescribed form and admission shall be made subject to the approval of the Director, CACEE.

4. Examination : M.A. Previous Examination shall consist of the following :-

i) 4 Theory Papers of 100 marks each	400 Marks
ii) Seminar	50 Marks
iii) Field Work/Case Study	50 Marks
Total	500 Marks

M.A. Final Examination shall consist of the following :-

i) 4 Theory Papers of 100 Marks each	400 Marks
ii) Project Work	50 Marks
iii) Seminar	50 Marks
Total	500 Marks

N.B. Such Courses as may be prescribed by the University from time to time.

5. For passing the examination a candidate shall be required to pass in theory papers and Case Study/Project Work/Seminar separately.

Ist Division 60% or more marks  
 IInd Division 48% or more marks  
 IIIrd Division 36% or more marks

There shall be no supplementary or second examination. A failure does not retain his seat next year. He shall have to apply afresh.

~~However, if a candidate passing in the Seminar, and has submitted his Case Study in M.A. Previous or Project Report in M.A. Final and fails to appear in the Annual Examination due to sickness, he can appear in Annual Examination next year.~~

If a candidate has failed in theory papers but has passed in Case Study in M.A. Previous/Project Report in M.A. Final, he shall have to appear in theory papers only in Annual Examination next year. His/her marks for Case Study/Project Report shall be carried forward next year.

6. Medium of instructions and examination will be in Hindi/English.

7. No candidate shall be allowed to take the Examination unless has :-

- i) attended atleast 75% of lectures delivered.
- ii) paid all dues
- iii) Obtained 'no dues' certificate from Library, Hostel and Department.
- iv) Submitted the Case Study in M.A. Previous and Project Report in M.A. Final atleast one month before the beginning of the examination.

8. Case Study / Project Report :

The subject of the Case Study/Project Report will be allotted to the candidate by the Director/Head at the beginning of the Session. A candidate will be required to submit 3 typed copies of the Case Study/Project Report.

The work will be valued by internal and external examiners jointly.

The Supervisor for the Project/Case Study appointed by the Director/Head shall be internal Examiner.

9. Seminar :- The candidate will be required to present one paper each in 2 seminars. The valuation will be done jointly by the Supervisor and atleast 2 teachers.

10. Qualification of Examiner :

1) All the Directors/Asst. Directors/Project Officers of Adult/Continuing Education of recognised University/Institutions who has atleast 5 years Field Experience/Teaching Experience in Population Education/Rural Studies/Journalism and Mass Communication.

2) Any teacher of a recognised University/College who has atleast 5 years experience in Rural Studies/Economics with specialisation in developmental studies/Social Work/Sociology with specialisation in Rural Studies Agriculture Science / Veterinary Science / Population Education/Mass communication and Journalism.

11. Remuneration :

The remuneration for setting question paper/marking answer books/Case Study/Project Report/Seminar etc. will be as per University Ordinance for Post-graduate Examination.

12. Qualification of Teacher :

All the Directors/Asst.Directors of Adult/Continuing Education of recognised University/Institutions who have atleast 3 years Field Experience/Teaching Experience in Rural Studies / Population Education / Journalism and Communication and also other teachers as per University/UGC norms.

13. Fee :

A candidate shall be required to pay the following fees for one academic year.

Proposed - ORDINANCE NO.41

Ordinance for Post Graduate Diploma in Labour Law and Labour Welfare

1. The duration of the course of Post Graduate Diploma in Labour Law and Labour Welfare shall be of one Academic Session commencing from July to June of each session under the faculty of Law.
2. The course is open to only regular students, hence no private candidate will be eligible to appear in the examination. Not more than sixty students will be admitted in the course.
3. The minimum qualification for admission to the course will be post graduate degree in any discipline attaining II class or bachelors degree of law with 48% marks of any University recognised by this University. However, relaxation of percentage of marks will be given to SC/ST/OBC candidates as per rules of M.P. Government for admission.
4. Candidates shall be admitted on merit on the basis of percentage of marks obtained in the qualifying examination and such other criteria as may be laid down from time to time by the University. Admission shall be supervised by a committee constituted by the Principal.
5. Reservation in admission will be given as per following provisions :-
  - (a) 18% for S.T. candidates, 15% for S.C. candidates and 14% for D.B.C. candidates.
  - (b) 5% seats shall be reserved for Military personnels ex service man and their wards (Ward, will include wife, sons and daughters only).
  - (c) 3% seats will be reserved for Physically Handicapped persons and freedom fighters.However, vacant seats of reserve quota shall be transferred to General Category.
6. In case of any dispute the decision of Kulpati of Vikram University shall be final.
7. The Principal of the College running the course will issue prospectus showing the rules of admission and prescribed fees alongwith admission form. The admission form will be submitted by the candidate in the college concerned duly completed in all respects.
8. Schedule of fees is prescribed as under :-
  - (a) Annual tuition fee Rs.600/-
  - (b) Annual examination Fee of the University will be Rs.300/- and other fees payable to the University will be as per schedule of fees prescribed by the University for the time being in force.

(c) Other college fees will be payable as per rules.

9. Scheme of examination :

(i) There will be following papers of 100 marks each :

Paper I : Industrial Relations.

Paper II : Labour Welfare.

Paper III : Labour Organisation and Personnel Management.

Paper IV : Wages and Social Security Legislation.

Paper V : Dissertation or Essay.

Dissertation will be of 60 marks and there will be a Viva-Voce of 40 marks on the dissertation.

Note : The detailed courses of the papers will be prescribed by the Board of Studies in Law of the University.

(ii) Minimum pass marks will be 40 in each paper alongwith an aggregate of 48% marks in all the papers.

(iii) There shall be no supplementary or second examination for failures. A failure will not regain his seat for the next session. However, a failure candidate or a candidate who fails to appear in the Annual Examination owing to sickness or any unavoidable reasons, can appear in all the papers at the immediate next examination only, after which no chance will be given to such a candidate to appear at the examination.

(iv) Candidate shall be awarded division in the annual examination as follows :-

I Division - 60% or more of the total marks.

II Division - 48% or more but less than 60%.

10. In matters of admission, examination and in all other matters not provided in this ordinance will be governed by the General ordinance of examination, some in so far as they are not inconsistent with the provision of this ordinance.

11. Attendance is compulsory. If a candidate fails to attend seventy five percent of total lecture delivered, he will not be permitted to appear in the examination. The Head of Department in his discretion may condone in special cases of shortfall in attendance.

## Ordinance for M.Phil (Environment Management)

1. The course shall be titled as Master of Philosophy in Environment Management. This course shall be conducted by the School of Studies in Botany, Vikram University, Ujjain.
2. The course shall be splitted in two semester with each semester of 5 months. The course shall be full-time and open to regular candidates only.
3. Minimum qualification for admission for M.Phil course shall be 55% in Master degree in any science subject or Technical/Professional course.
4. A common advisory committee to run all the environment management courses will be constituted by the Vice Chancellor and a teacher connected with course teaching. In case Head of the Department and Course Coordinator is same, Vice Chancellor may nominate one more teacher from the S.S. in Botany or Life Science Faculty.
5.
  - (i) The total seats in the course shall be eight.
  - (ii) Four additional seats will be reserved for teachers sponsored from recognised institutions. These seats shall be made available only if applications in this category are received but in no case these seats could be converted or filled in by any other category of candidates.
6. Admission shall be through an Entrance Test. The mechanism of conducting this test shall be formulated by the advisory committee and approved by the Vice Chancellor. However, following conditions shall be applicable additionally.
  - (i) Separate applications are required for each course.
  - (ii) The medium of Entrance Test shall be english.
  - (iii) On the basis of Entrance Test a merit list, candidates from vikram University shall be given a weightage of 10% of the marks obtained by the candidates in the Entrance Test.
  - (iv) Separate merit list will be prepared for the course. No interchange of seats shall be permitted between the two courses (PGDEM/M.PHIL).
  - (v) Sponsored candidates will be exempted from the Entrance Test. If the number of applicants exceed the number of seats interse merit will be prepared on the basis of qualifications i.e. the order of perference will be Ph.D./M.Phil/M.Sc., M.E., M.Tech or equivalent for M.Phil.

(vi) If the written test more than one candidate get equal marks, then the percentage of marks in qualifying examination will decide their merit.

7. The University will conduct the written examination of the semesters for the course.

- ~~(i) Medium of examination will be english.~~
- (ii) Examinations will be held in both the semesters.
- (iii) A. The first semester will consist of (a) two theory papers (b) Seminar, Group Discussion (c) Status or Survey Report based on Research.  
 B. The second semester will consist of (a) two theory papers (b) Practicals (c) Dissertation based on Research/On Site or In Plant Training.  
 C. In each semester a candidate shall be declared pass only when he/she gets (a) 25% marks in each theory paper and 50% in aggregate of the theory papers. (b) 25% in each separately i.e. Seminar, Group Discussion and 50% in aggregate. (c) The pass marks for practicals and dissertation/report will be 50% in aggregate. D. If a candidate fails in any of these i.e. (a) Theory (b) Seminar, Group Discussion. Survey/Status Report or Practicals, etc. (c) On Site Work Report/Dissertation he/she shall be declared as fail.
- (iv) A candidate getting 50% marks in one theory paper and 25% or more marks in other theory paper and failing due to aggregate, can continue in the second semester. He/She will get only one chance to appear in this paper. The same will be applicable for the second semester examination theory papers.
- (v) A candidate failing in any semester may be permitted to appear as ex-student in next indentical semester i.e. one failing in first semester may appear as ex-student in first semester of next session.
- (vi) Division will be accorded as per University rules.
- (vii) The University shall award the degree of M.Phil.
- (viii) There shall be no provision for revaluation in theory, seminar, group discussion, survey/status report or dissertation.

On the recommendation of the advisory committee the scheme of examination and course content shall be approved by the Board of Studies in Botany. The fee structure, rates of remuneration and panel of examiners, etc. will be prepared by the advisory committee and approved by the Vice Chancellor.

State Government rules for reservations in admission to the course shall be followed.

In all matters of dispute or provisions not covered in the ordinance the decision of the Vice Chancellor shall be final.

(REVISED)

Ordinance for P.G. Diploma in Environment Management

1. The course shall be titled as Post Graduate Diploma in Environment Management. This course shall be conducted by the School of Studies in Botany, Vikram University, Ujjain.
2. The P.G. Diploma will be a self financing course and will operate as modular system in which the candidate can pass one semester in one session and second semester in next session but within two years from the joining of the first semester.
3. The course shall be splitted in two semester with each semester of 5 months. Each course shall be full-time and open to regular candidates only.
4. Admission in P.G. Diploma the minimum qualification will be 50% at M.Sc. in any science subject/Bachelor degree at Technical /Professional course.
5. A common advisory committee to run all the environment management courses will be constituted by the Vice-Chancellor and a teacher connected with course teaching. In case Head of the Department and Course Coordinator is same, Vice Chancellor may nominate one more teacher from the S.S. in Botany or Life Science Faculty.
6.
  - (i) The total seats in the course shall be eight.
  - (ii) In P.G. Diploma course four seats shall be open and four for sponsored candidates. The sponsorship should be from recognised/registered institution, industry, autonomous or non government or international organisations, state or central government departments and their undertakings. Any vacant seat in any of the category can be filled from other category of the candidates in P.G. Diploma course.
7. Admission shall be through an Entrance Test. The mechanism of conducting this test shall be formulated by the advisory committee and approved by the Vice Chancellor. However, following conditions shall be applicable additionally.
  - (i) Separate applications are required for each course. In case a candidate is an applicant for open as well as sponsored category he/she shall have to apply separately for both.
  - (ii) The medium of Entrance Test shall be english.
  - (iii) On the basis of Entrance Test a merit list will be prepared. In finalising the merit list, candidates from Vikram University shall be given a weightage of 10% of the marks obtained by the candidates in the

- (iv) Separate merit list will be prepared for each course. No interchange of seats shall be permitted between the two courses (PGDEM/M.PHIL).
- (v) Sponsored candidates will be exempted from the Entrance Test. If the number of applicants exceed the number of seats interse merit will be prepared on the basis of qualifications i.e. the order of preference will be Ph.D./M.Phil/M.Sc., M.E., M.Tech./B.E., B.Tech. or equivalent for P.G.Diploma.

- (i) Medium of examination will be english.
- (ii) Examinations will be held in both the semesters.
- (iii) A. The first semester will consist of (a) two theory papers (b) Seminar, Group Discussion (c) Status or Survey Report based on Research.  
 B. The second semester will consist of (a) two theory papers (b) Practicals (c) Dissertation based on Research/On site or In Plant Training.  
 C. In each semester a candidate shall be declared pass only when he/she gets (a) 25% marks in each theory paper and 50% in aggregate of the theory papers. (b) 25% in each separately i.e. seminar, Group Discussion and 50% in aggregate.  
 (c) The pass marks for practicals and dissertation/report will be 50% in aggregate.  
 D. If a candidate fails in any of these i.e. (a) Theory (b) Seminar, Group Discussion, Survey/Status Report or Practicals, etc. (c) On Site Work Report/Dissertation he/she shall be declared as fail.
- (iv) A candidate getting 50% marks in one theory paper and 25% or more marks in other theory paper, and failing due to aggregate, can continue in the second semester. He/She will get only one chance to appear in this paper. The same will be applicable for the second semester examination theory papers.
- (v) A candidate failing in any semester may be permitted to appear as ex-student in next indentical semester i.e. one failing in first semester may appear as ex-student in first semester of next session.
- (vi) Division will be accorded as per University rules.
- (vii) The University shall award the degree of PGDEM. In PGDEM, if a candidate completes only first semester and leaves the course he/she will be awarded a certificate under the signature of Course Coordinator and Registrar.

- (viii) There shall be no provision for revaluation in theory, seminar, group discussion, survey/status report or dissertation.
9. On the recommendation of the advisory committee the scheme of examination and course content shall be approved by the Board of Studies in Botany. The fee structure, rates of remuneration and panel of examiners, etc. will be prepared by the advisory committee and approved by the Vice Chancellor.
10. State Government rules for reservations in admission to these courses shall be followed.
11. In all matters of dispute or provisions not covered in the ordinance the decision of the Vice Chancellor shall be final.

## FACULTY OF SCIENCE

## MASTER OF COMPUTER APPLICATIONS

(Approved by Coordination Committee on 30-10-1995)

1. DURATION OF COURSE :

The duration of the course of study for Master of Computer Application shall extend over six Semester in three academic years and it will be a full time programme. Normally, the course will commence in the month of July every year. The number of seats is limited to 30.

2. ELIGIBILITY FOR THE COURSE :

Every candidate seeking admission to Master of Computer Application program shall have Bachelor's Degree with second division or Master's Degree with second division in any discipline including Arts / Science / Commerce / Law / Medicine / Engineering / Veterinary Science / Agriculture / Technology of Vikram University, Ujjain or any other statutory University recognised as equivalent there to. The candidate must have also passed Mathematics at 10+2 stage of Madhya Pradesh Board of Secondary Education or its equivalent.

Candidates who, have not obtained a Bachelor's degree or Master's degree at the time of application but plan to appear in the final year of degree or post graduate examination during the academic session may also apply. However, such candidates will have to produce an evidence of having passed the Bachelor's or Masters degree in second division by a date fixed by the Head of the institution failing which their candidature for admission will not be considered. The admission to the course shall continue till all 30 seats are filled up.

3. Candidates admitted to this course shall not be allowed to join any other course of study or to appear in any other examination.
4. Subject to the requirements of admission indicated above, admission to the programme shall be on the merit determined on the basis of entrance examination as per rules/direction of the University.
5. The reservation of seats for different categories shall be decided by the University through a notification and is subject to change from time to time.
6. The admission fee, tuition fee, examination fee and other fees shall be decided by the University through a notification. These will be subject to change from time to time.
7. The Master of Computer Application programme shall consist of six semesters and there shall be a University examination at the end of each Semester. The Semester shall run consecutively.

8. A candidate who has been admitted to Master of Computer Application programme in terms of the provisions referred in paragraph (2) above and who has attended a regular course of study for the full semester period, shall be eligible to appear in the University examination of that Semester. However, no candidate shall be eligible to take any semester examination unless he has attended at least 75% of the lectures delivered.
9. Students appearing in the sixth semester examination should ~~submit their project report in triplicate at least two weeks~~ before the commencement of that semester examination, failing which they will not be allowed to appear in the examination of that semester.
10. A candidate shall be eligible to appear in Second / Fourth / Sixth Semester examination only after having passed the first / third / fifth Semester examination respectively.
- Provided that if a candidate fails in any two papers in first / third / fifth semester examination, he will be promoted to the second / fourth / sixth semester course respectively. A candidate failing in any two papers of any semester shall be eligible to take examination in the papers in which he failed in the next semester examination of the course.
11. The semester examination shall consist of
- (i) Theory Examination.
  - (ii) Practical / Viva Examination.
  - (iii) Internal Assessment for theory practical and or viva separately.
- The method of awarding marks of internal assessment of theory, practicals etc. will be decided by the Head of the institution in consultation with the University.
12. If a candidate fails in internal assessment of even one paper, he shall not be permitted to take the university examination of that semester.
13. If a candidate fails in more than two papers in any semester examination but has passed in internal assessment examination but has passed in internal assessment he may be allowed to appear as an ex-student in the examination of the semester in which he has failed. The ex-student will be given two chances to clear the papers in which he has failed. If the ex-student does not clear those papers in two attempts, he shall secure fresh admission in that semester. If a candidate fails in internal assessment, he shall be required to secure fresh admission in the semester in which he has failed.
14. The course of study for each semester shall be as per scheme provided in the prospectus. These will be subject to change from time to time. Unless otherwise provided the theory examination in each paper shall be of three hours duration.
15. Candidates shall have to pass separately in the University examinations and internal assessment given in clause 10.

16. For passing each semester examination, the candidates shall be required to secure at least 25% marks in each theory paper of the University examination, 40% in aggregate in theory, 40% in practicals / Viva and 40% marks in internal assessment seperately, 40% marks in aggregate shall be compulsory for passing each semester examination.
17. Candidates shall be awarded division after their having duly passed all the six semester examinations, practical examinations and internal assessment ~~on the basis of the aggregate marks obtained in all the six semester examination and all the internal assessment.~~
