Proposed - ORDINANCE NO.50
(UNDER SECTION - N 37 (II to V))

ORDINANCE FOR POST GRADUATE DIPLOMA COURSES
IN THE FACULTY OF MANAGEMENT STUDIES

- 1) These Diploma shall be known as Post Graduate Diploma in
 - i) Personnel Management and Industrial Relations.
 - ii) Marketing Management
 - iii) Financial Management
 - iv) Any other as approved by the Appropriate Bodies of the University.
 - 2) The duration of these courses of study shall extend over one year / two semesters.
 - 3) The intake for each Diploma course in each of the institute/college shall be decided by the university from time to time.
 - 4) Qualifications for Admission to the Diplomas :
 - i) Every candidate seeking admission to these Diploma courses shall have passed a Bachelor's/Master's degree examination with atleast (40% Marks) in any discipline including Arts, Science, Commerce, Agriculture, Social Science, Engineering and Technology, Life Science, Medical Science etc. of any indian or foreign University recognised by the university for this purpose.
 - ii) Admission to this course shall be made through multistep selection process - consisting of :
 - a) Written entrance test in English Language, Mathematics, General awareness etc. 300 Marks
 - b) Personal interview 50 Marks
 - iii) The conduct of written test and personal interview will be as decided by the university from time to time.
 - iv) A Preliminary Merit list will be prepared on the basis of the marks obtained in the Written Entrance Test and candidates according to merit list equal to double the number of seats available will be called for Personal interview.
 - v) The Final Merit list will be prepared on the basis of the total marks obtained in the Written Entrance Test and Personal Interview. Candidates shall be admitted from this final merit list strictly according to the merit and declared accordingly.
- Note : The language for written entrance test shall be English.

- vi) Reservations for SCs/STs and other categories shall be made according to the guidelines issued by the University from time to time.
- vii) All candidates seeking admission shall have to go through all the multisteps of selection process mentioned in clause 4 (ii) above.

5) The Diploma courses shall consist of

- a) Such courses (papers) as may be prescribed by the University from time to time.
- b) Such inplant-training, projects as may be prescribed by the Head of relevant institutions and
- c) Such Factory visits as may be prescribed by the Head of relevant institutions.

6) The medium of examination shall be English / Hindi.

- 7) a) Each student shall have to appear in the written University examination and internal assessment/s which will be held in the manner prescribed from time to time in each paper by the Director/Head of the Institute. Each paper in the written University Examination will be of three hours duration.

Each course (paper) will be of 100 marks and the distribution of marks shall be as under :

University Examination 70 marks and internal assessment 30 marks, but in the paper on Project Report, marks will be given out of 100 to be allocated equally between external and internal examiners.

- b) For passing the examination, the candidate shall be required to secure atleast 36% marks separately in university examination as well as in internal assessment in each of the prescribed course (paper) and in aggregate of 45% in the semester.
- c) There shall be no supplementary or second examination for failures.

Provided, further, that if a candidate after passing in internal assessment in all papers fails in not more than two papers in any one semester or annual examination but secures atleast 45% marks in aggregate in the papers cleared of that examination, he/she will be allowed to keep the term (ATKT) and promoted to the next semester/examination of those papers in which he/she has failed alongwith the examination of the semester/annual examination concerned. He/She shall be eligible to carry the backlog of two papers of each semester or annual examination but in no case he/she shall be permitted to carry back-log of more than four papers at a time.

Proposed - ORDINANCE NO.51

BACHELOR OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION

1. The examination for the Degree of Physical Education shall consist of parts which will known B.P.Ed. degree in Physical Education. The duration of course will be one academic year.
2. A candidate who after taking his bachelor's degree of any discipline i.e. (B.Sc. B.A. B.Com. etc.) of the University or of any statutory university of India or any other Examination of any statutory institution as equivalent to the graduate degree of the university shall be admitted to the Bachelor of Physical Education for the Degree of Bachelor of Physical Education.
3. The scope of the examination and the number of students to be admitted etc. shall be determined by the university from time to time.
4. For the examination a candidate will be declared successful if he/she obtains atleast 33% of the aggregate marks in the subject. The examinee must pass separately in both theory and practical. The division in which a candidate is place shall be determined on the basis of aggregate of marks obtained in both theory and practical exams.
5. Successful candidate who obtains 60% or more of the aggregate marks shall be placed in first division. Candidate who, obtains 45% or above but less than 60% of the aggregate marks will be placed in the second division. All successful candidates obtaining less than 45% of marks will be placed in Third division.
6. The intake and admission rules for B.P.Ed. course shall be decided by the university from time to time.
7. In matters of admission, attendance, examinations and in all other matters not provided in this ordinance, the degree course shall be governed by the General provisions of the relevant ordinance of the university, save in so far as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance.

Proposed - ORDINANCE NO.52

MASTER OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION

1. The examination for the Master of Physical Education shall consist of two parts. Part one known as Master of Physical Education previous examination and part two known as final examination. The examination for the Master of Physical Education (Summer Course) shall be consist of 3 parts and will be completed in 3 years.
2. A candidate who after taking his bachelor's degree of Physical Education of the University or at any statutory university of India or any other examination of any statutory body as equivalent to the B.P.Ed. degree of the University and has completed a regular course of study shall be admitted to the previous examination for the degree of Master of Physical Education [M.P.Ed. & M.P.Ed. (S.C.)]
3. A candidate who, after passing the M.P. Ed. Previous examination of the University has completed a regular course of study for one academic year shall be admitted to the final examination for the degree of Master of Physical Education. A candidate who has passed the previous examination from another university may also be admitted to Final examination after obtaining necessary permission from the Kulpati, provided He/She has offered for his/her previous examination a course of an equivalent standard with almost identical syllabus as is required for the previous examination of this university and has attended a regular course of study for one academic year.
4. The scope of the examination and the number of students to be admitted shall be determined by the university from time to time.
5. For both the previous and final examination a candidate will be declared successful if He/She obtains atleast 36% of the aggregate marks in the subject. The examinee must pass separately in both theory and practical. No division will be assigned on the result of the previous examination. The division in which a candidate is placed shall be determined on the basis of aggregate of marks obtained in both, the M.P.Ed. Previous and Final Exams.
6. Successful candidate who obtain 60% or more of the aggregate shall be placed in the first division. Those obtaining less than 60% but not less than 48% will be placed in the second division. All these successful candidates obtaining less than 48% placed in the Third Division.
7. The intake and admission rules for M.P.Ed. course shall be decided by the university from time to time.
8. The classes of M.P. Ed. (Summer Course) will be in the summer months.
9. After atleast 90 days teaching, a examination will be organised by University, For M.P.Ed. (Summer Course)

10. A candidate after passing the M.P.Ed. (Summer Course) First year, shall be admitted in II Year of M.P.Ed. (S.C.) A candidate who has passed the first year of M.P.Ed. may also be admitted in the II year of M.P.(Ed.). A candidate after passing the M.P.Ed. (Summer Course) II year, shall be admitted in final year of M.P.Ed. (S.C.) for all examination of M.P.Ed.(S.C.), a candidate will be declared successful in He/she obtains atleast 36% of the aggregate marks. The examinee must pass separately in both theory and practical. The division of a candidate shall be determined on the basis of aggregate of marks obtained in I year, II year and Final year.
11. The placement/award of division will be similar to the regular M.P.Ed. Course.
12. In matters of admission, attendance, examinations and in all other matters not provided in this ordinance, the degree course shall be governed by the General provisions of the relevant ordinance of the university, save in so far as they all not inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance.

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(P.G.Diploma In Environment Management-Correspondence Course)

1. The course shall be titled as Post Graduate Diploma in Environment Management. The course shall be conducted by the School of Studies in Botany, Vikram University, Ujjain, M.P.
2. The course shall be,
 - (i) a correspondence course
 - (ii) a self financing course
 - (iii) of three semester. Each semester will be of five months. Total course duration will be 15-16 months.
3. Minimum qualification for admission to the course shall be,
 - (i) A Master degree in any science subject.

OR

A Master or Bachelor degree in any Technical/Professional subject.

(ii) B.Sc. candidate too are eligible, if the candidate has, any of the following qualifications,

(a) An additional Diploma or equivalent course certificate of at least one year duration.

(b) Permanent Employee in any organisation.

4. An advisory committee to run these courses will be constituted by the Vice Chancellor which will consist of the Head, S.S. in Botany, Course Coordinator and teacher connected with the course teaching. In case Head of the Department and Course Coordinator is same, Vice Chancellor may nominate any other teacher from S.S. in Botany or any other teacher from the Life Science faculty.

The advisory committee shall be common for all the three environment management courses covered in Ordinance No.42 (a) (b)

5. The total number of intake of the candidates for each semester shall be twenty four with a maximum of seventy two per full term of course i.e. three semesters.
6. (a) The admission shall be on merit basis, but in case the number of applications received exceeds, this the advisory committee in consultation with the Vice Chancellor can recommend for an Entrance Test. The medium of this test shall be english.
- (b) Candidates in any permanent employment and if sponsored by the organisation will be exempted from appearing in the entrance test.

(c) Candidates enrolled in other courses, including other environmental management courses, for B.Sc. in Environment and Botany (Regular). For each course separate application should be submitted.

(d) In case more than one candidate gets equal marks in test or qualifying examination, his percentage at the next lower examinations shall be considered.

6. The G.S. in Botany and the Vikram University will conduct the examinations for the course.

(i) Medium of examination shall be English.
 (ii) The course will be of three semesters. The course will consist of following sets,

- (a) Four Theory Papers
- (b) Seminars
- (c) Practicals
- (d) A write up on environmental aspects
- (e) Preparation of Status Report/Survey Report/ On Site Training Report/Field based work report.

All the examinations shall be decided by the Course advisory committee and shall be held at University head quarters. The following rules will be applicable for passing out.

The candidate will be accorded division according to the University rules.

A candidate will be declared pass only if he gets a total aggregate of 50% marks in each set of examination in each semester i.e. separately in theory, practicals, write up seminar, on site or survey report.

A candidate will be declared fail if he gets less than 25% marks in any set of the examination.

A candidate who is failing shall be allowed to appear in the next semester but only one chance to clear that semester shall be given.

A candidate shall get the Diploma if he/she passes out all the three semesters.

No candidate will be permitted to continue in the course if he fails in first and second semester.

There is no provision of any revaluation in any part of the examination of this course.

7. The advisory committee of the course will propose the course content, break up of courses for different semesters, fee structures and other related matters of the course. The course content will be approved by the Board of Studies in Botany as well as Board of Studies in Environment Science, if constituted at any stage.

8. Government rules for reservations in admission will be followed but no seats would be left vacant if the candidates in any category of reservation are not available.

9. All matters of dispute or provisions not covered in the above shall be the decision of the Vice Chancellor shall be final.

ORDINANCE FOR BHMS. DEGREE EXAMINATION

DURATION OF THE COURSE :

- (1) The Degree Course of Bachelor of Homoeopathy Medicine and Surgery (B.H.M.S.) shall comprise a course of study spread over a period of 5½ years. Including compulsory Internship of one year duration after passing the final Degree Examination as under :-

- (ii) A candidate shall be awarded the Degree of B.H.M.S. (Bachelor of Homoeopathy Medicine and Surgery) by the University after passing the Final Examination and completion of the compulsory Internship of the specified period (one year).

Admission Qualification :

No candidate shall be admitted the B.H.M.S. course :-

- (a) Passed the Intermediate Science/Higher Secondary (10+2) examination or its equivalent with Physics, Chemistry and Biology as his subjects.
- (b) Attained the age of 17 years on or before 31st December of the year of his admission to the first year of the course.

Medium of Instruction/Examination :

English or Hindi

SCHEME OF B.H.M.S. EXAMINATION

EXAMINATION :

- (1) There shall be four examinations, namely :
- (i) First B.H.M.S. Examination shall be held at the end of one and half year B.H.M.S. Course.
- (ii) Second B.H.M.S. Examination shall be held at the end of two and half year of the Course.
- (iii) Third B.H.M.S. Examination shall be held at the end of three and half year of the Course.

- (1) Fourth/Second Examination shall be held at the end of four and half year of the Course.
- (2) The examination shall ordinary be held twice in a year, main and supplementary/second examination preferably in the month of November - December and April - May.
- (3) The examination in each subject shall be written. Practical/Clinical and oral three hours shall be allowed for each written paper.
- (4) A candidate shall be eligible for admission to any B.H.M.S. Examinations, Provided he has attended a regular Course of study, Which means, attended atleast 75% of lectures and practicals/clinicals held in each subject separately.
- (5) Pass-Mark : For each subject shall be 50% in each written and 50% in practicals (including Oral and or Clinicals) Separately. Candidates securing 75% OR more marks in a subject shall be declared to have obtained Distinction (Honours) in that subject, provided that the candidate has passed in the first attempt.
- (6) A candidate who fails to pass in subject or subjects may be admitted to a supplementary/second examination in the subject or subjects of that part of the examination in which he has failed.
- (7) If a candidate obtains pass marks in the subject or subjects at the supplementary/second examination, he shall declared to have passed at the examination as a whole.
- (8) If such candidate fails to pass in the subject or subjects at the supplementary/second examination, he may appear again in that subject or subjects at the next annual and or subsequent examinations on the production of a certificate to the effect that he had attended, to the satisfaction of the head of the institution a further course of study during the next academic year in the subject or subjects in which he had failed, provided that all the part of the examination shall be completed in four chances (including main and the supplementary) from the date when the complete examination come into force for the first time.
- (9) If a candidate fails to pass in all the subjects within the prescribed four chances, he shall be required to persecute a further course of study in all the subjects and in all parts for one year to the satisfaction of the head of the college and appear for examination in all the subjects.
5. The syllabus & curriculam for B.H.M.S. Degree Course would be according to syllabus of Central Council of Homoeopathy, New Delhi (Govt. of India). The details of the course is given in attached Appendix " A "
