

Ordinance and Regulations relating to the Degree of Ayurveda Vachaspati-M.D.(Ayu)
(Doctor of Medicine-Ayurveda)

1. AIM AND OBJECTIVE

The aim of the Post-graduate degree course shall be the orientation in specialities and Super specialities and to produce experts and specialists who can be competent and efficient Teacher Clinicians, Surgeons, Pharmacists, Research workers and Profound Scholars in the respective field of specialisation of Ayurveda.

2. SPECIALITY IN WHICH POST- GRADUATE DEGREE IS CONDUCTS

3. THE NOMENCLATURE OF POST- GRADUATE DEGREE

Ayurveda Vachaspati, M.D. Ayurveda (DRAVYA GUNA VIGYAN)

4. ELIGIBILITY

1. The degree in Ayurveda of this University or of those University/Statutory institutions which are recognised as equivalent by Central Council of the Indiau Medicine, New Delhi
2. Only those who have passed all the examinations at degree level in the respective field of specialisation in first attempt shall be eligible for admission.

5. MODE OF ADMISSION

(1) There shall be an Admission Committee consisting of following.

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- The Selection shall be made strictly on the basis of one common final merit index based on written test and interview as follows :-
- Written Test Index (to be calculated out of 90 marks)
 - Interview Index (to be calculated out of 10 Marks)
 - Final merit Index (100 marks)
- (3) The minimum marks in the final merit index for eligibility for admission shall be 50% (40% in the case of reserved categories).

- (4) The written test shall consist of one common written paper comprising of objective type of questions and covering all the subjects of Ayurveda, the details of which shall be decided by the Admission Committee constituted as above.
- (5) The number of the candidates to be called for interview (on the basis of the marks obtained in the written test) shall not exceed three times the number of seats advertised. The same rule will apply to SC/ST quota also.
- (6) The names of the candidates for Interview will be intimated to the Admission Committee which shall interview the candidates without indicating the marks obtained in the written test.

6. PERIOD OF STUDY AND ATTENDANCE

- (1) The candidates have to undergo a period of study for three years after admission, out of which one year shall be devoted to Preliminary course and next two years devoted to Speciality Course.
- (2) The students will be required to attend 75% of total lectures, practicals and clinicals separately to become eligible to appear in the examination.
- (3) The students will be required to attend the hospital and other duties as may be allotted to them by the Admission Committee during the course of study. All the students will be required to do House Job duties and clinical Registrar's duties in their respective departments during preliminary and final courses respectively.
- (4) The students will also be required to attend special lectures, demonstrations, seminars, study tours and such other activities, which may be arranged by the teaching departments.
- (5) No relaxation in period of study shall be given to a candidate who have already obtained Post-graduate degree in one speciality and thereafter desires to undergo post-graduate course in other speciality.

- 6) The teachers having a three years teaching experience can be allowed to undertake Post-graduate degree training as regular candidate. No relaxation in the duration of the study will be made to in-service physician / teacher

7. METHOD OF TRAINING

- (1) Intensive training will be given in classical knowledge along with comparative and critical study in respective speciality.
- (2) The emphasis should be given on in-service training and not in didactic lecturers.
- (3) The candidates are required to know about the methods and technique of research work done in the respective fields.
- (4) The training requires in such a pattern so as to be given graded responsibility in management and treatment of patients entrusted to his care and to deal emergencies.
- (5) The candidate should be required to participate in the teaching and training programmes of under graduate students or intern in their subjects.
- (6) In the first year period the emphasis should be given to give adequate knowledge in the applied aspects of the fundamental of all the subjects of Ayurveda and adequate training in the basic science of medicine in all its applied and comparative aspects relevant to the speciality concerned with special reference to the fundamentals of Ayurveda.
- (7) The clinical training should aim to the extend the knowledge of the candidate to undertake independent work as a specialist.
- (8) The thorough and intensive training on a planned programmed should be given to the students during all stages of the course and such programmes should be available for the inspection and scrutiny of the Central Council of Indian Medicine.
- (9) Adequate training in teaching technology and research methods should be undertaken during the course of studies.

8. THESIS

- (1) Before the candidate is allowed to undertake the work of thesis, the title of the thesis should be registered with University within the six months of admission and the synopsis should be approved at the end of preliminary year.

- The application of registration of the title of the thesis should clearly mention the full title of the thesis with a synopsis of the proposed scheme of work indicating the familiarity of the candidate with the proposed theme of work and the name of the department and the name and designation of the Guide/Supervisor and Co-guide.
- (3) Once the title for thesis is approved, the candidate will not be allowed to change the title or the proposed theme of work.
 - (4) The registration of the candidate will be cancelled if the candidate fails to submit the title of thesis along with synopsis within the specified period as mentioned above.
 - (5) No candidate shall be allowed to submit the thesis before the expiry of one calendar year after registration of the title of the thesis and before six months of the final year.
 - (6) The subject of the thesis must be related with the subject matter of the speciality offered by the candidate.
 - (7) The thesis should place on record the methods and potentiality of the research carried out by the candidate on the problem selected by him and completed under the guidance of the teacher approved by the University.
 - (8) The thesis should consist of critical survey of relevant literature, research, results of the research, discussion on the basis of existing literature on the subject, conclusion, summary of thesis and references cited in the thesis.
 - (9) There will be a Scrutiny Committee constituted by the University which will scrutinise and approve the title of the thesis and proposed scheme of work submitted as per rules. The subject of every thesis should be practical oriented devoid of unpromising specialities and should be helpful in the development of service of Ayurveda.
 - (10) The thesis ordinarily consist of exceeding 200 typed pages. The thesis should contain at the end a Summary of not more than 1500 words covering the conclusion drawn by the candidate.
 - (11) The Guide/Supervisor shall be a person of status of a Professor/Reader/Lecturer possessing at least five years Post-graduate teaching experience in the subject ^{as} Professor, a Reader and a lecturer can guide in maximum three, two and one students respectively in each academic year.
 - (12) The thesis must be satisfactory as regards literary presentation and suitable for publication either as such as in an abridged form.

the candidate shall have to pass all the separately theory papers/and practical/clinical and viva voce examination separately.

7- If a candidate fails in one paper in the Preliminary Examination he shall have to pass in the paper before he is allowed to appear in the Final Examination

8- If the candidate fails in a theory paper and/or in practical/viva voce examination of either Preliminary or Final Examination, the candidate shall have to appear in the subsequent examination in all the written papers and practical/viva voce examination without requiring to submit a fresh thesis.

9- The Post-graduate degree shall be conferred on the candidate after the acceptance of the thesis and after the candidate has passed the final examination in the speciality.

0. DETAILS OF EXAMINATION

I. Preliminary Examination :-

(1) The Preliminary Examination at the end of one academic year of admission shall be in the following papers

Paper I

Medical statistics and Research Methodology

Paper II

- (a) Fundamentals of Non-clinical subjects of Ayurveda with an emphasis on applied aspects along with relevant studies of fundamental of Basic Science of Medicine
- OR
- (b) Fundamentals of clinical subjects of Ayurveda with an emphasis on applied aspects along with relevant studies of fundamental of Basic Science of Medicine

(2) The candidate shall have to go the training in the department concerned for the speciality opted by the candidate as under :-

- (a) Regular clinical training in the Hospital.
- (b) Practical training of research work carried out in the department.
- (c) Study of literature related to speciality.
- (d) Active participation in various Seminars Symposiums and Discussions.
- (e) Finalisation of Topic of thesis and synopsis thereof.

- 3) Four copies of the bound thesis together with one certificate from the guide must reach the office of the Registrar three months before the final examination
- (14) The thesis shall be assessed by four examiners appointed by the University, two of them will be external and two internal. One of the internal examiners of the thesis should be the guide under whom the candidate has worked the thesis.
- (15) The thesis shall only be accepted after unanimous approval by the examiners appointed to examine it.
- (16) If the thesis is not accepted it will be referred back to the candidate with the remarks of the examiners and the candidate can resubmit the thesis, after making necessary improvements in the light of the examiner's report to the University, but not beyond a further period of six months.
- (17) The candidate shall be permitted to appear at Final Examination post-graduate degree in Ayurveda consisting of theory, oral and practicals including clinical, only after the thesis has been approved by the examiners appointed for the purpose.
- (18) One copy of the Synopsis of the title of thesis shall be submitted to the Registrar, Central Council of Indian Medicine as soon as the title is approved. One copy of the accepted thesis will be lodged in the library of the Central Council of Indian Medicine, New Delhi.

9. EXAMINATION AND ASSESSMENT

The post graduate degree shall have two examinations as follows :-

- 1- The Preliminary Examination at the end of one academic year after admission conducted by the University.
- 2- The Final Examination at the end of two academic years, after the Preliminary Examination.
- 3- The Final Examination will be held after completing two calendar years after passing Preliminary Examination and the candidates can avail of a maximum of two chances. The Final Examination will be held twice at an interval of six months.
- 4- No marks will be allotted in any part of the examination. Valuers should award 'Pass' or 'Fail'
- 5- Examination will ordinarily be held in the month of May-June and October-November every year.

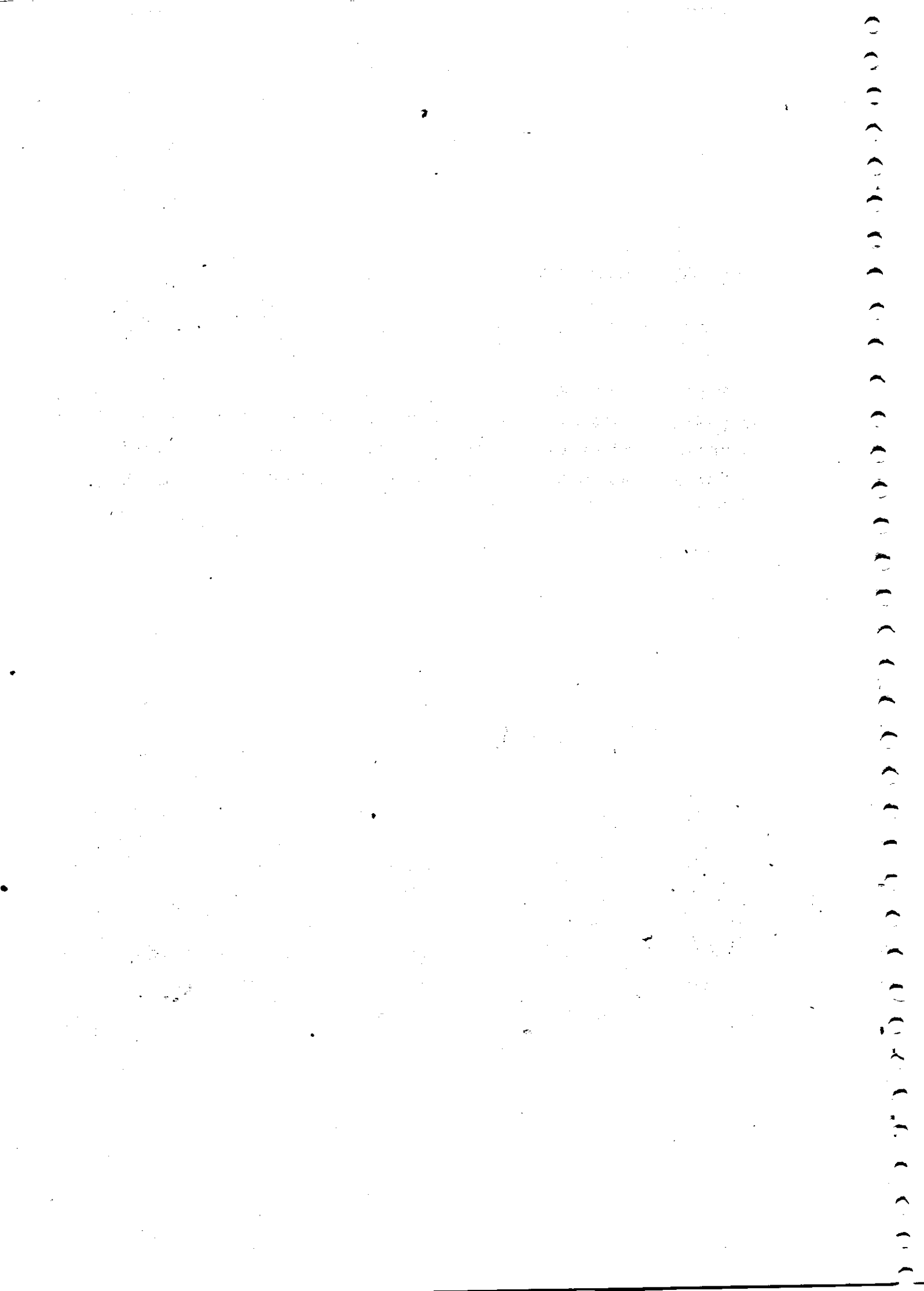
The assessment of the work done during the first year on the above points shall be done at the time of examination. For oral / viva-voce examination one external and one internal examiners shall be appointed.

- I The Final Examination shall consist of
- (i) Thesis
 - (ii) Written Papers
 - (iii) Clinical,
 - (iv) Oral / viva-voce and
 - (v) Practical examination as the case may be

There shall be four theory papers in the speciality and one practical/clinical and viva-voce

11. SYLLABUS

Syllabus for the course shall be as per Central Council & Indian Medicine.



ORDINANCE FOR COURSES IN HONOURS AT
UNDERGRADUATE LEVEL

1. The courses in Honours at under graduate level shall be run in University Teaching Departments under any of the Faculties of the University.
2. The duration of these courses of study shall extend over three years / six semesters.
3. The intake and fees for each of these courses shall be decided by the university from time to time.
4. Every candidate seeking admission to these courses shall have passed 10+2 course of M.P. Board / CBSE / or an equivalent body with a minimum of 50 percent marks.
5. Admissions under these courses will be made either by conducting a written entrance test or by merit.
6. Admissions to reserved category candidates shall be made according to the rules issued by the university from time to time.
7. The courses in Honours shall consist of :
 - a) such courses (papers) as prescribed by the university from time to time.
 - b) such lab. work, experiments, practicals, inplant training, projects etc. as may be prescribed by the university from time to time.
 - c) such scheme of examination as prescribed by the university from time to time.
8. There shall not be any provision for private candidates.
9. Each student shall have to appear in the examination of theory / practicals and internal assessment. The internal assessment will be

held in the manner prescribed from time to time by the Head of the Department.

a) 20 percent marks of each paper will be earmarked for internal assessment.

b) For passing the examination, the candidate shall be required to secure atleast 40% marks in aggregate in university examination and in internal assessment in each of the prescribed subject. However, the candidate will be required to obtain a minimum of 33 percent marks in university examination (Theory + Practicals) to pass in that subject.

10.a) If the course is run on annual basis, university general rules regarding conduct of examinations, supplementary examinations, grace marks etc. on yearly basis will be applied.

b) If the course is run on semester basis, the rules will be as follows :

There shall be no supplementary or second examination.

Provided further, that if a candidate fails in not more than one subject in any one semester examination but secures atleast 40% marks in aggregate in the subjects cleared of that examination, candidate will be allowed to keep the term (ATKT) and promoted to the next semester examination of those subjects in which he/she has failed alongwith the examination of the semester examination concerned. Candidate shall be eligible to carry the backlog of one subject of each semester examination but in no case candidate shall be permitted to carry backlog of more than two subjects at a time.

Provided further, that if a candidate fails in more than one subject in any semester examination, candidate may be allowed to appear as an ex-student in the next semester examination.

Provided further, that if a candidate fails in some subjects of earlier semester and clears the final semester, candidate will be awarded degree only in the year when he clears the papers of earlier semesters. In such situation, marksheet for each semester

will be issued separately and a composite marksheet will be issued once the candidate clears all the subjects.

11. No candidate shall be allowed to take the Annual / Semester University Examination unless one has :
- i) Attended atleast 75% of lectures / practicals delivered.
 - ii) Paid all the fee due.
 - iii) Obtained 'NO DUES' certificate from the concerned Department.
 - iv) Submitted the Project Report, as notified by the Head.
 - v) Received inplant training as prescribed by the Head.
12. The Division shall be awarded on the basis of Marks obtained in Internal Assessment and university examination taken together.
- 65% or above – First Class
 - 50% or above – Second Class
- Candidates obtaining more than 40% but less than 50% will be declared pass but without Honours degree.
13. A candidate has to complete the entire course of Honours within a maximum period of five years from the session of first admission.
14. In matters of admission, attendance, examinations and in all other matters not provided in this ordinance, the courses in Honours shall be governed by the provisions of the relevant ordinances of the same in the university so far as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance.
15. In case of any dispute / ambiguity, the ruling of the Vice-Chancellor shall be final.

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Ordinance for M.A. in Education

Nodal Agency :-

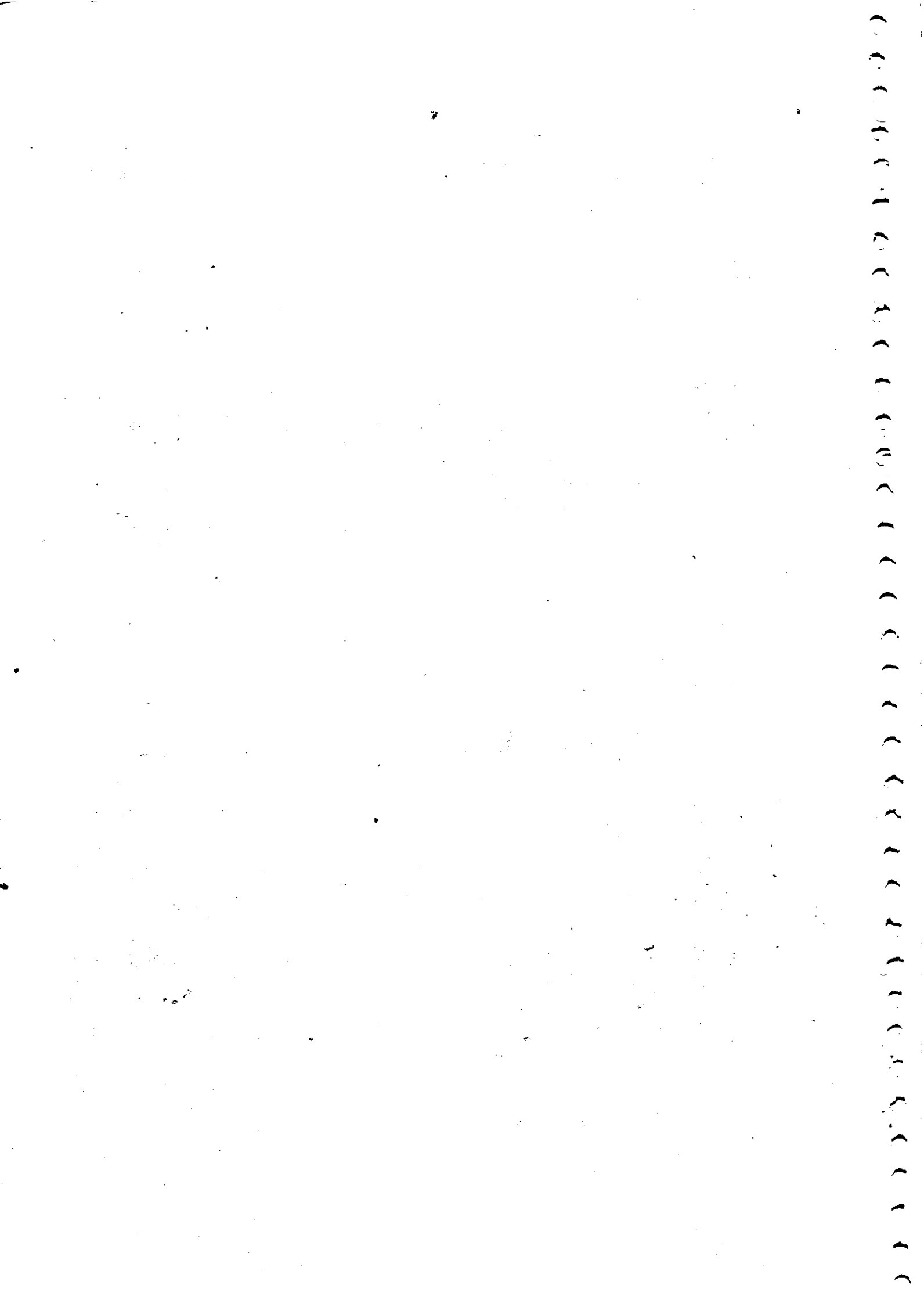
This department has been also selected since 1992 as a Nodal agency by the U.G.C., New Delhi for monitoring and evaluation of all the universities of M.P.

विक्रम विश्वविद्यालय, उज्जैन

अध्यादेश क्रमांक - 70

कर्मकाण्ड उपाधि-पत्र

1. उपाधिपत्र (डिप्लोमा) का नाम -

इस उपाधिपत्र का नाम कर्मकाण्ड उपाधि-पत्र होगा ।

2. पाठ्यक्रम की अवधि -

कर्मकाण्ड उपाधिपत्र पाठ्यक्रम की अवधि एक वर्ष होगी । यह एक पूर्णकालीन पाठ्यक्रम होगा । पाठ्यक्रम का आरंभ प्रत्येक वर्ष के जुलाई मास से होगा । स्थान (Seats), स्ववित्तीय स्थान (Payment Seats), स्थान आरक्षण एवम् प्रवेश नियमों में शिथिलता का निर्धारण विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा समय-समय पर निश्चित मार्गदर्शक सिद्धांतों के आधार पर किया जाएगा ।

3. पाठ्यक्रम के लिए पात्रता -

कर्मकाण्ड उपाधिपत्र पाठ्यक्रम में प्रवेश के लिए आवेदन करने वाले प्रत्येक आवेदक को माध्यमिक शिक्षा मण्डल म. प्र. भोपाल की हायर सेकेंडरी परीक्षा (10+2) अथवा अन्य समकक्ष मान्यता प्राप्त परीक्षा में उत्तीर्ण होना अनिवार्य होगा ।

4. पाठ्यक्रम में प्रवेश, उल्लिखित पात्रता के अधीन गुणानुक्रम योग्यता एवं व्यक्तिगत साक्षात्कार के आधार पर विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा समय-समय पर निर्देशित प्रक्रिया के अंतर्गत दिया जाएगा ।

5. प्रवेश शुल्क, शिक्षण शुल्क, परीक्षा शुल्क एवं अन्य शुल्क जो विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा समय-समय पर निर्धारित हों, देय होंगे ।

6. कर्मकाण्ड उपाधिपत्र पाठ्यक्रम हेतु शैक्षणिक सत्र के अन्त में विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा एक वार्षिक परीक्षा ली जाएगी ।

7. इस पाठ्यक्रम में चार प्रश्नपत्र होंगे । प्रत्येक प्रश्नपत्र 100 अंकों का होगा । प्रत्येक प्रश्नपत्र में 50 अंक सैद्धान्तिक तथा 50 अंक प्रायोगिक परीक्षा के लिए निर्धारित होंगे । उत्तीर्ण होने के लिए सैद्धान्तिक प्रश्नपत्र में पूर्णांक 50 में से न्यूनतम 17 एवं प्रायोगिक परीक्षा के पूर्णांक 50 में से न्यूनतम 17 अंक प्राप्त करना अनिवार्य होगा ।

8. चार शैक्षणिक प्रणालियों में न्यूनतम निर्धारित अंक प्राप्त न करने वाले अथवा शैक्षणिक एवं प्रायोगिक परीक्षा में समग्र प्राप्तांकों का 40% से कम प्राप्त करने वाले परीक्षार्थियों को अनुत्तीर्ण घोषित किया जाएगा। अनुत्तीर्ण परीक्षार्थियों को अगले शैक्षणिक सत्र की वार्षिक परीक्षा में केवल पूर्व छात्र के रूप में परीक्षा देने की पात्रता होगी। प्रायोगिक परीक्षा के उत्तीर्ण आगामी परीक्षा में मान्य किये जाएंगे।
9. प्रत्येक प्रश्न पत्र में प्रायोगिक परीक्षा में उत्तीर्ण-होना अनिवार्य होगा। किसी भी प्रश्नपत्र की प्रायोगिक परीक्षा में अनुत्तीर्ण परीक्षार्थियों को अनुत्तीर्ण घोषित किया जाएगा। अनुत्तीर्ण परीक्षार्थियों को अगले शैक्षणिक सत्र की वार्षिक परीक्षा में केवल पूर्व छात्र के रूप में प्रायोगिक परीक्षा देने की पात्रता होगी।
10. पूर्व छात्र को केवल एक अवसर प्रदान किया जाएगा।
11. कृपांक के विषय में विश्वविद्यालयीन स्नातक परीक्षा के लिए निर्धारित विवरण मान्य होगी।
12. कर्मकाण्ड उपाधिपत्र का पाठ्यक्रम विवरणिका में निर्दिष्ट योजना के अनुसार होगा जिसे विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा यथासमय परिवर्तित किया जा सकेगा।
13. प्रायोगिक परीक्षा के अन्तर्गत उच्चारण तथा कर्मकाण्ड की प्रायोगिक विधियों आदि का समावेश होगा जिसका निर्धारण प्राध्ययन केन्द्र द्वारा समय-समय पर किया जाएगा।
14. परीक्षार्थियों को सैद्धान्तिक तथा प्रायोगिक दोनों परीक्षाओं के सम्मिलित प्राप्तांकों के आधार पर परीक्षा में श्रेणी प्रदान की जाएगी।
श्रेणी का निर्धारण निम्नानुसार होगा -
प्रथम श्रेणी - समग्र प्राप्तांकों का 60% एवं अधिक
द्वितीय श्रेणी - समग्र प्राप्तांकों का 50% एवं अधिक किन्तु 60% से कम
तृतीय श्रेणी - समग्र प्राप्तांकों का 40% एवं अधिक किन्तु 50% से कम।
15. इस अध्यादेश में जो प्रावधान नहीं हैं, उनके विषय में विश्वविद्यालय के वे सामान्य नियम लागू होंगे, जिन्हें विश्वविद्यालय के सक्षम निकायों द्वारा समय-समय पर निर्धारित किया गया हो।
