ORDINANCE FOR THE DEGREE OF MASTR OF SCIENCE IN MEDICAL ANATOMY, MEDICAL PHYSIOLOGY, MEDICAL BIOCHEMISTRY.

1. The ordinance comes in force with immediate effect.
2. The degree of Master of science in Medical Anatomy, Medical Physiology and Medical Biochemistry shall be abbreviated respectively as M.Sc. Medical Anatomy M.Sc. Physiology & M.Sc. Medical Biochemistry.
3. The courses of M.Sc. Medical Anatomy M.Sc. Physiology & M.Sc. Medical Biochemistry shall only be held in Medical Colleges and in no other College.
4. A person will be eligible for admission in M.Sc. Medical Anatomy, M.Sc. Medical Physiology and M.Sc. Medical Biochemistry, if he / she holds Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery degree (M.B.B.S.), Bachelor in Allied health sciences i.e. B.D.S., B.P.T. of Vikram University or any other University of India or abroad, recognized as equivalent, thereto B.Sc. with Zoology as principal subject for M.Sc. Medical Anatomy & M.Sc. Medical Physiology and M.B.B.S and B.Sc. with Biochemistry or Chemistry as principal subject for M.Sc. Medical Biochemistry or equivalent from a recognized University. Aggregate marks of the degree completed will be the criteria for admission.
5. The course of study for Master of Science in Medical Anatomy, Medical Physiology & Medical Biochemistry shall be three year extended over three academic sessions and shall consist of parts A. M.Sc. (previous) extended over one academic year and part B., M. Sc. (final) extended over next two academic years.
6. The degree of M.Sc. Medical Anatomy M.Sc. Medical Physiology & M.Sc. Medical Biochemistry shall not be awarded unless the training & dissertation (thesis) is completed.
7. The admission to these courses shall be granted by the Head of the institution on the basis of merit obtained in all the subjects. In case of dispute merit shall be decided on the basis of the total marks obtained in the principle subject. In case of NRI / Foreign candidates, merit obtained in equivalent degree from recognized university of India or abroad shall be considered.
8. Number of students admitted in M.Sc. Medical Anatomy, M.Sc. Medical Physiology and M.Sc. Medical Biochemistry shall ten seats respectively in each courses, out of these ten admissions in each course, two admissions shall be reserved for NRI / Foreigner / NRI sponsored students in each course. In case reserved seats of NRI / Foreigners / NRI sponsored remain vacant they can be converted in general seats.
9. The students admitted in M.Sc. Medical Anatomy, M.Sc. Medical Physiology or M.Sc. Medical Biochemistry shall study and work full time as per the schedule of the institution.
10. A. The students admitted for these courses in M.Sc. previous shall be studying all the three subjects Human Anatomy, Human Physiology and Human Biochemistry as orientation course and shall pass in all the three subjects to become eligible to get admission in final year.
B. The period of learning in all the three subjects shall be 160 hrs. in Human Anatomy, 160 hrs. in Human Physiology and 160 hrs. in Human Biochemistry, out of which at least 1 / 3 period shall be devoted for theory and remaining 2 / 3 period for practical. The syllabus of courses shall be equivalent to the syllabus of M.B.B.S. courses.

C. The students after passing M.Sc. previous examination shall be eligible to study in M.Sc. Final classes. In M.Sc. final year the students of M.Sc. Medical Anatomy, M.Sc. Medical Physiology or M.Sc. Medical Biochemistry shall study in their respective subject i.e. students of M.Sc. Medical Anatomy shall study and work in department of Anatomy, students of M.Sc. Medical Physiology shall study and work in the department of Physiology and students of M.Sc. Biochemistry shall study and work in department of Biochemistry.

D. The students of M.Sc. final of all three aforesaid subjects shall submit their topic of dissertation individually with synopsis, in second year to the Vikram University, ujjain, duly signed by Guide and Co-Guide duly recognized by Vikram University. During the same period they shall also learn the basics of Medical education and conduct the practicals by teaching the students of M.Sc. previous and or students of first professional of M.B.B.S. course.

E. The student shall be carrying out the dissertation himself under the guidance of guide and co-guide. The topic of thesis will be allotted by the guide in final year i.e. IInd year.

F. The topic of dissertation shall not be the same as that of thesis which has been accepted by the Vikram University in previous years.

G. Minor changes in topic of the thesis shall be permitted before submitting the final work.

H. Students shall be liable to change the topic of dissertation after recommendation of the guide not later than the fourth semester with due prior permission of the University authorities.

I. University examination of final year shall be held at end of the academic year.

11. A. After passing M.Sc. final year examination in all three aforesaid subjects, the students shall Compulsorily do the 12 months Internship in the respective subjects.

B. During the Internship the intern shall complete the dissertation and submit the thesis in the University at least four months before the completion of Internship.

C. The intern shall also do the teaching work, both theory and practicals, assigned to them by the head of the department.

D. The degree of M.Sc. Medical Anatomy, Medical Physiology & Biochemistry shall only be awarded by the University when the thesis has been approved by the examiners appointed by the University and the 12 months internship has been completed.

12. No leave or vacation shall be granted to the students or interns during the course of their study or internship.

13. There shall be two examinations conducted by the University one in the 1st year & second in the final year.

Note –

- i) The University exam will be conducted by one external & one internal in theory & Practical of Ist year university examination.
- ii) There shall be two examiners in each subject, one internal from the concerned institution and one external examiner from the other institutions out of the jurisdiction of Vikram University for the both the theory and practical examination for M. SC. 1st year
In M.SC.3rd year examination there will be two external & two internal examiners
- iii) Minimum 50% marks is required for passing separately in theory & Practical examination.
 - a) A candidate having appeared in all the subjects in the same examination and passed that examination in the first attempt and secure 75% of marks or more of grand total marks prescribed will be declared to have passed the examination with Distinction.

- b) A candidate having appeared in all the subjects in the same examination and passed that examination in the first attempt and secured 60% of marks or more but less than 75% of grand total marks prescribed will be declared to have passed the examination in **First Class**.
- c) A candidate having appeared in the subjects in the same examination and passed that examination in the first attempt securing more than 50% and less than 60% of marks is placed in the **Second Class**
- d) A candidate passing the university examination in more than one attempt shall be placed in **Pass Class** irrespective of the percentage of marks secured by him / her in the examination.
- e) One grace mark is permissible in any one subject either in theory or practical in all the university examination that is 1st year & 3rd year examination .
- 14) A student shall be permitted to appear in examination after attaining 80 percent attendance in aggregate
- 15) Supplementary examination shall be completed within two months of the declaration of the result of main examination.
- 16) The dissertation (thesis) submitted by the intern shall be evaluated by the viva voce by one External and one internal examiners in the eleventh month of internship.
- 17) The degree shall be awarded only after completing the 12 month internship.
- 18) Student should complete the course in maximum five years, and there shall be three attempts to be given in each year.

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**ORDINANCE FOR POST-GRADUATE EDUCATION IN
HOMOEOPATHY [M. D. HOMOEOPATHY]**

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General Rules

The aim of the Post-Graduate course in Homoeopathy shall be the orientation in specialities and to produce specialists, who can be efficient teacher, medical practitioner and research worker in the respective field.

There shall be one academic session in a year from January to December. The candidates will be admitted to the M.D. Homoeopathy Course in the month of January every year.

Part - I

I. COURSE OF STUDY

The course of study for the Post-Graduate Degree (M.D. Homoeopathy) examination shall be of three years duration including one year of house job. The examination shall be conducted in two parts as under :

- a. M. D. (Homoeopathy) part I to be held in six months after completion of house job of one year.
- b. M. D. (Homoeopathy) part II to be held in one year & six months after Part I Examination.

The University shall grant the Post-Graduate Degree M.D. (Homoeopathy) in the following Branches of specialities and the candidate shall be required to offer any one of the branches of specialities for study to secure Post-Graduate Degree.

(i) General Subjects

- (a) The Man in Health (Holistic Concept);
- (b) The Man in Disease (Holistic Concept); and
- (c) History of Medicine, Scientific Methodology, including Research Methodology and Statistics.

(ii) Special Subjects

- (a) Organon of Medicine with Homoeopathic Philosophy;
- (b) Homoeopathic Materia Medica including applied aspects;
- (c) Repertory;
- (d) Homoeopathic Pharmacy;
- (e) Practice of Medicine;
- (f) Paediatrics; and
- (g) Psychiatry.

A candidate for M.D. (Hom.) shall select one of the special subjects as his speciality at the time of admission.

ADMISSION TO COURSE

- (i) **Admission Capacity** - Number of students to be admitted to each of the Post-Graduate departments shall be ~~6~~ ^{According to CCH} every year, subject to the condition that the guide will be permitted to have maximum 3 students under his guidance.
- (ii) **Eligibility for Admission to M.D. (Hom.) Part I** - A candidate shall be admitted to M.D. (Hom.) course who possesses the degree of :
- Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery or equivalent qualification in Homoeopathy included in the Second Schedule of the C.C.H. Act. after undergoing a course of study of not less than five years and six months duration including one year compulsory internship; or
 - Bachelor of Homoeopathy Medicine and Surgery (Graded Degree) or equivalent qualification in Homoeopathy included in the Second Schedule of the CCH Act. after undergoing a course of study of not less than two years duration.
- (iii) **Selection of Candidate for Admission** - Selection will be made strictly on the basis of merit, by a selection committee consisting of persons as under :
- Head of the Institution.
 - Head of the Post-Graduate departments.
- (iv) **Eligibility for Admission to M.D. (Hom) Part II** - The candidate who has passed the examination of M.D. (Hom.) part I shall be entitled for admission in M.D. (Homoeopathy) part II in the concerned branch of speciality.
- (v) **Reservation**
- 25% of the total seats shall be reserved for in service candidates nominated by the Central / State Government in the various specialities as may be determined by them from time to time, out of which 8% seats shall be reserved for in service natural born scheduled cast candidates and 6% for natural born scheduled tribe candidates.
 - 8% of the seats, after excluding the seats reserved for in service candidate to be nominated by the Central / state Government, as mentioned in clause (a) above shall be reserved for natural born scheduled caste candidates and 6% seats for natural born scheduled tribe candidates. Selection for these vacancies shall be made as per roster, a system to be notified by the University.
 - The remaining seats shall be called 'General seats' and the unfilled seats from those reserved under clause (a) and (b) above after exhausting the waiting list, shall be filled by the candidates of general category subject to the condition that at least 50 % of these seats shall be filled in by the candidates passing BHMS Examination from the Vikram University.

Part-III

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3. EXAMINATIONS

- (i) The examination shall be conducted in two parts namely;
- M.D. (Hom.) part I, which is to be held six months after completion of house job of one year's duration.
 - M.D. (Hom.) part II which is to be held one year and six months after part I examination.
- (ii) Every candidate seeking admission to part I of the examination shall submit application to the University with the following documents, namely;
- A certificate from the principal or Head of the institution about the completion of the course of studies in the subject in which the candidate seeks admission to the examination; and
 - A certificate of having completed one year house job in a Homoeopathy hospital.
- (iii) Every candidate seeking admission to Part II of the examinations shall submit a dissertation of not less than 10000 words. The dissertation shall form the basis of viva-voce examination.
- (iv) **M.D. (Hom.) Part I Examination**
- Part I M.D. (Hom.) Examination shall be held in general subjects and shall consist of:
 - One theory paper in each of general subject of not less than three hours duration;
 - Viva-voce / Practical examination in each general subject, to be held by not less than three examiners together out of which one shall be the supervisor (guide);
 - The Three examiners shall jointly assess the knowledge of the candidate for recommending the result to the University as passed or failed.
- (v) **M.D. (Hom.) Part II Examination**
- Every candidate shall prepare and submit four printed or typed copies of dissertation embodying his own research and contribution in advancing the knowledge in the subject to the University for approval not later than six months prior to the holding of part II examination.
 - The dissertation shall be submitted to the Guide/supervisor at least three months before the time fixed for submitting it to the University and the Guide/Supervisor shall certify that the work has not previously formed the basis for award of any post graduate degree or diploma and that the work is the record of the candidate's personal efforts and submitted to the University duly countersigned by the Guide/Supervisor.
 - The examiners appointed to conduct the examination shall scrutinize the dissertation and jointly reports whether the dissertation be accepted or rejected or may make suggestion, as they deem fit.
 - The candidate shall be allowed to appear for the part II examination three months after the examiner accepts the dissertation. Provided that the candidate, whose dissertation has not been accepted, may be permitted to resubmit the same within a period of six months and not more than one year after rejection.

(vi) Every Candidate seeking admission to part II of the examination shall submit an application to the University with the following, namely;

- a. A certificate showing that he has passed part I examination; and
- b. A certificate from his guide about the completion of studies in the subjects in which the candidate is seeking admission to the examination.

(vii) Part II M.D. (Hom.) Examination shall be held in the subject of specialty opted by the candidate at the time of admission, and shall consist of:

- a. Two written theory papers, each of not less than three hours duration.
- b. One practical / clinical examination, including Viva-Voce, in the subject specialty, to test the candidate's acumen and his ability and working knowledge in the practice of the speciality and there shall be three examiners together, including one Supervisor (Guide) in the subject, for examining the candidate.

Provided that all the three examiners shall jointly assess the knowledge of the candidate for recommending the result to the University as passed or failed.

(viii) Provision for failure candidates :

A candidate failing in any paper at the M.D. (Hom.) part - I Examination shall be allowed to clear the same in not more than three attempts at a subsequent examination. However, he may be allowed provisionally to join the M.D.(Hom.) part -- II classes and like other candidates he may be allowed to get the subject of thesis registered.

In case such candidates fail to clear the failing subject in three subsequent attempts i.e. at the immediately following three examinations, his provisional permission to join the part II class shall be withdrawn and the subject of thesis cancelled. Such candidates shall have to re-appear in the M.D. (Hom.) Part I examination as fresh in all theory papers and practicals taken together.

Note :

1. Non appearance at an examination shall be counted as an attempt.
2. A candidate failing in more than one subject at the M.D. (Hom.) Part I examination shall not be required to appear at the subsequent examination in the subject / subjects which he has already cleared.

(ix) Supplementary Examination :

- a. There will be no provision of supplementary examination for a candidate failing at the M.D.(Hom.) part - II examination even in one theory paper/ practical test.
- b. Candidate failing even in one theory paper/practical/ clinical test viva-voce shall be deemed to have failed in all the papers. Such candidate may re-appear at the subsequent examination as ex-student but they will have to appear in all theory papers and practical tests, without requiring to submit a fresh thesis.

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FACULTY OF MEDICINE

Post graduate (MD/MS) examination

1. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

QUALIFICATION:

Candidate for the above degrees (MD/MS) must be:

- (a) An M.B.B.S. of this University. or
- (b) An M.B.B.S. of any other University recognized by the Executive Council of this University and Medical Council of India for the purpose.
- (c) Completed one year internship.

2. ADMISSION: as per rules of MCI and Govt. of Madhya Pradesh.

3. DURATION OF COURSE: Three academic years including period of examination.

4. SCHEME OF EXAMINATION:

M.D. / M.S examination, in any subject shall consist of Thesis, Theory Papers, and Clinical / Practical and Oral examinations.

(a) Thesis

(i) Every candidate shall carry out work on an assigned research project under the guidance of a recognized Post Graduate Teacher, the result of which shall be written up and submitted in the form of a Thesis.

(ii) Work for writing the Thesis is aimed at contributing to the development of a spirit of enquiry, besides exposing the candidate to the techniques of research, critical analysis, acquaintance with the latest advances in medical science and the manner of identifying and consulting available literature.

(iii) Thesis shall be submitted and approved before the commencement of theory and clinical / practical examination.

(iv) The thesis shall be examined by a minimum of Four examiners; Two internal and two external, and on acceptance of the thesis by minimum two examiners, including one external, the candidate shall be eligible for appearing for final examination.

(b) Theory

- (i) There shall be **four** theory papers.
- (ii) Out of these, **first** paper shall be of Basic Medical Sciences and **fourth** shall be of recent advances.
- (iii) The **second & third** paper shall be based on the syllabus, as specified by the concerned subject specialty.
- (iv) The **first & fourth** theory paper shall be set & evaluated by two internal examiners, and the remaining (**second & third**) shall be set & evaluated by the two externals.
- (v) The theory examinations shall be held sufficiently earlier than the Clinical and Practical examination.

(c) Clinical / Practical and Oral

- (i) Clinical examination for the subjects in Clinical Sciences shall be conducted to test the knowledge and competence of the candidates for undertaking independent work as a Specialist / Teacher, for which candidate shall examine a minimum one long and two short cases.
- (ii) Practical examination for the subjects in Basic Medical Sciences shall be conducted to test the knowledge and competence of the candidates for making valid and relevant observations based on the experimental / Laboratory studies and his ability to perform such studies as are relevant to his subject.
- (iii) The Oral examination shall be thorough and shall aim at assessing the candidate knowledge and competence about the subject, investigative procedures, therapeutic technique and other aspects of the specialty, which form a part of the examination.
- (iv) No marks will be assigned. for this part of examination. The fitness of the candidate for the degree will be decided by all four examiners, (two external and two internal). Of the two internal examiners, one should be Head of the department & the other should be a P.G. teacher for minimum lat 3 years.

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5. RESULT OF EXAMINATION:

- (i) No marks will be assigned.
- (ii) The fitness of the candidate for the degree will be decided by all four examiners, (two external and two internal). Of the two internal examiners, one should be Head of the department & the other should be a P.G. teacher for minimum three years.
- (iii) The results (Theory & Practical, Combined) of all post – graduate examinations will be declared as **Pass / Fail** in the concerned examination.

GUIDELINES FOR APPOINTMET OF POST GRADUATE EXAMINERS

1. No teacher shall be appointed as an examiner in any subject unless he / she fulfils the minimum requirements for recognition as a Post Graduate teacher as laid down by the Medical council of India and has teaching experience of 8 (Eight) years as a Lecturer / Asst. Professor in the subject in a medical college in the same department.
2. There shall be at least four examiners in each subject. Out of which at last 50% (Fifty percent) shall be external examiners. The external examiner who fulfils the condition mentioned above shall ordinarily be invited from another recognized university preferably outside the state; provided that in exceptional circumstances examination may be held with three examiners with permission of **Registrar, Vikram University** or **Dean, Faculty of Medicine**.
3. An external examiner may ordinarily be appointed for not more than three years consecutively. Thereafter he/she may be reappointed after an interval of two years.
4. The same set of examiners shall ordinarily be responsible for the thesis, written and practical examination.
5. The Head of the Department of the institution concerned shall ordinarily be one of the internal examiners and second internal examiner shall rotate after every two years, among the available P.G. teachers in the department.

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
